Estampas de la Raza: Contemporary Prints from the Romo Collection

Estampas de la Raza (Prints for the People): Contemporary Mexican American Prints from the Romo Collection, is an art book that presents a selection of Mexican American and Latino prints from the art collection of Harriet and Ricardo Romo. This book was published in 2012 by the McNay Art Museum and written by curator of prints and drawings, Lyle W. Williams, and contains a prologue written by UC Davis Professor, Carlos Francisco Jackson.

Estampas de la Raza (Prints for the People) gives us an account of the development and contribution of Chicano and Latino artists to the printmaking tradition. It includes many unique prints from the screen printing studios Self Help Graphics, Modern Multiples, and Coronado Studios. These studios were formed to promote community arts and the work of local artists to use art as an instrument for social change.

The prints in Estampas de la Raza range in date from 1984 to 2011 and incorporate art that reflects the social, political and economic issues faced by Latinos. Nearly fifty artists and sixty prints are presented through a thematic outline that includes the interaction of Mexican and American cultures, the inclusion of Latino icons, the struggle for equality and labor rights, the search for Mexican American identity, and the influence of Latino culture in the arts. Details of how each artist approached their art to represent the Mexican American, Latino and Chicano experience is provided.

Carlos Francisco Jackson, also a visual artist and writer, is the director of TANA, Taller Arte del Nuevo Amanecer, a community-based fully-functioning silkscreen art center here in Woodland. It is a collaborative partnership with the Chicana/o Studies Program at the UC Davis and the Woodland community which offers a teaching center for the arts for the community and an exhibition space for Chicano/Latino Arts

Both live and silent auction offer such fabulous items as Disneyland tickets, golf packages, signed 49's memorabilia, River Cats, Giants' and A's tickets and numerous items from local restaurants and businesses, including a private, catered dinner for 8 donated by Blue Jeans Black Tie Catering Company. There will be wine tasting courtesy of local wineries, and beer provided by the Caledonia Club (Scottish Games), luscious homemade appetizers, dessert and coffee.

"From Percolate to Paper/From Process to Pen" April Author Event—T.E. Watson By: Mary Mackenzie

Our Author Event on **Saturday, April 18**, begins with a members-only reception at **9 A.M. in the Leake Room** at the library, 250 First St. At 9:30, our speaker T.E. Watson will begin his talk which is open to the public. Memberships are available at the door and new members pay half price.

T.E. Watson is a prolific, talented and enthusiastic author who has been writing for over 40 years, both fiction and non-fiction, in many fields, but, as his web site, www.tewatsononline.com reveals, his favorite genre is children's books. Titles and subject matter of his books, many of which are written for "children of all ages", reflect his compelling interests: all things Scottish (he was born in Scotland), engrossing tales, imaginative scenarios and humor. Every book contains beautiful illustrations to accompany the intriguing story.

T.E. will speak on *"From Percolate to Paper/From Process to Pen"* thus sharing his passion for the process of writing. Watson is sometimes referred to as an "Imaginician", because he combines imagination, technical expertise and a tad of magic with ease in his writing. As a former teacher, he strives to empower his audiences to find their own interior "Imaginician".

Mr. Watson has written many interesting books for children. One of his popular books set in Scotland is *Glen Robbie: a Scottish Fairy Tale*, which takes place in the beautiful Scottish Highlands, but no one knows exactly where. It is a wondrous, magical village filled with giving and generous Highlands Fairies. But something dreadful will occur if the citizens of Glen Robbie "cannae" (cannot) find someone to help them. The village will vanish forever! Many ambassadors from Glen Robbie try and fail sadly. Everyday time draws closer to the demise this wonderful wee village. But all is not lost. There are two ambassadors still away from their home and they have been gone a very long time...

Another of his Scottish tales is *The Man Who Spoke With Cats* set in the beautiful regions of southern Scotland. The story is based on an original story told to the author by his grandmother. It is one of the most emotionally charged, heartwarming stories T. E. Watson has ever written.

Jeremiah Dragonfly's Special Day is a story of friendship and caring, and doing things for others just because you want to and not because you have to. The Going West Series is a fun and rip roaring new adventure series for readers in 4th grade and up to get a good feel for what the real west was like for the 19th century pioneers migrating to California. This series has been endorsed by the NEA and is recommended by many teachers and historians.

Mr. Watson has received numerous awards in this country as well as in Scotland for his works of fiction: T. E. Watson is past President of The Northern California Publishers and Authors, is a member of the SCBWI Society of Children's Book Writers and Illustrators, member of the California Writers Club, as well as many organizations overseas. He is very active in the Scottish community and is determined to never retire from writing for children.

His pet project is a book for authors, ***Presenting Successful School Visits***. Having become known as the Guru of School Presentations, his abilities to generate excitement about reading and writing as well as his motivational skills when presenting to children of all ages are well known. "When a child discovers they can do something well and feel great about what they have done, that feeling stays with them."

Please join us Saturday morning, April 18 at 9 a.m., for what promises to be an informative and inspiring experience with T. E. Watson. Books will be available for purchase and signing. Refreshments will be served. See FOL web site for information at www.woodlandfol.org


