**CURRENT AFFAIRS & RESOLUTIONS Roberta Eales: roberta@abbeydale21.plus.com** Hopefully you will have all let your Delegate know how you want them to vote on your behalf at NFWI Annual Meeting for the resolution being presented - "Dental Health Matters". However, now is the time to think about 2025's resolution! Between July and September, WIs can submit resolutions about current issues they are concerned about to NFWI. If your WI is concerned about an issue of interest, do a bit of research, get some facts and figures and the Federation's resolutions team can help you perfect the wording. Please note that any potential resolution has to go through the Federation but that does not prevent you from seeking some initial help from NFWI Public Affairs team.

The request to submit resolutions does seem to come round quickly each year. Sometimes it feels we have just got to grips with the latest resolution when we need to start thinking about a new one. There is some discontent among the National WI membership about this rate of change and the issue of a biannual process has been raised, ie only having a resolution every 2 years, but at present, the National Board of Trustees feel that to be a responsive organisation and be able to respond quickly to topical issues, a yearly process is best. However, WIs do not need to campaign on the current resolution, if a past resolution has more resonance with their members. For example, a member may have experience of organ transplantation and "Time to talk about organ donation" is particularly relevant to your WI, or "Link together for loneliness" may be something your WI prefers to work on. There are many issues affecting women that the WI has mandates for. We can all fall back on our trusted "Keep Britain tidy" campaign! Looking ahead, September is blood and gynaecological cancer awareness month, which ties in nicely with our ovarian cancer "See the signs" campaign and "Make a match" campaign which promotes stem cell registration to enable more people to receive potentially life-saving stem cell transplants. The choice is yours but we do hope that your WI will engage with the longstanding WI campaigning history.

<u>The Great Big Green Week 8 to 16 June - Let's Swap</u> together for Good

The Great Big Green Week, taking place between 8 – 16 June, will see people across the country come together in a week-long celebration of support for action to tackle climate change and protect nature. It will show how people and communities are making swaps every day to help create a better tomorrow - and it's time for politicians to step up and play their part.

The theme for Great Big Green Week 2024 is 'Let's swap together for good'.

From neighbours swapping skills in repair cafes or allotments, to businesses swapping fossil fuels for solar panels, to friends swapping fast fashion for second hand finds – every swap adds up to make a big difference. By taking action together at the same time in every corner of the country, politicians will be unable to ignore that people care about tackling climate change and protecting nature.

As a member of the Climate Coalition, the WI takes part in this event every year and encourages members to get involved. You can choose what your WI would like to do – it could be making 'swapping' pledges at your meeting, pledging to swap single-use plastic bottles for a reusable water bottle, swapping to a green energy supplier that uses renewable energy or swap to wildlife friendly gardening, choosing plants for pollinators, not using chemicals and creating wildlife habitats. How about having a plant swap or refreshing your summer wardrobe with a clothes swap?
