What Do /II These Letters Means

HI V Vaccine

Protects girls aboys from the human papilloma virus (HPV), which causes 6 types of cancer. HPV vaccines work best when given at ages 11 or 12. HPV vaccine series is given as 2 shots, 6 - 12 months apart. (Or 3 shots if started after age 15)

Tdap Vaccine

Protects against 3
serious diseases:
tetanus (lockjaw),
diphtheria, and
pertussis (whooping
cough). Pre-teens
should get this shot at
ages 11 or 12.



Meningitis Vaccine

Protects against some of the bacteria that can cause meningitis (swelling of the lining around the brain and spinal cord) and sepsis (an infection in the blood). Pre-teens should get this shot at ages 11 or 12.
