Creating Original Cloth Judy Langille

Create beautiful fabric of your own design using a variety of printing, painting and surface techniques. Begin the course by using a thermal image machine to create precise and detailed screen images that you will print. Proceed to paint, monoprint and stamp on the material followed by using dyes, discharge agents and glue. These fabrics can be used as original cloth or can be combined with fusing techniques to create a collage or quilt. All levels.

Materials list

Rubber gloves, apron

Plastic from dry cleaning bags or light weight plastic to wrap fabric in to take it home

Freezer Paper- sold at grocery stores - you can share with others

Seam Ripper ****** sold at sewing store

Scissors for paper.

T-pins for pinning work down, straight pins will work.

Fabric- can be 100% cotton, silk or rayon that is prepared for dying- a yard or two.

Blank silkscreen frame- at least 12" x 18"- but can be bigger, if you have one.

Paper towels or old hand towels for cleaning up.

**Padding for your work table, something that can be pinned into like flannel,,thick plastic for insulating floor, foam core or insulation board works well.

Material Fee- \$10 for dyes and chemicals

I will have cotton fabric for sale for approximately \$8 a yard. I will also have silk scarves available if you want them. They are approximately \$12



Featured Member



Kerry Cogen started quilting on a whim when she was in graduate school in the late 1980's. There was a quilt store in her neighborhood in Berkeley, California, so she signed up for a class...to make an Ocean Waves quilt! Finding herself a bit in over her head in the waves, she set that quilt aside and made what she describes as an "ugly" flannel quilt, a log cabin, and other basic quilts.

When she pulled out the Ocean Waves quilt some time later, she decided to use it as a wedding gift for her older sister. The quilt was king-sized, and she hand quilted it, so, in fact, it became a fifth anniversary gift. Sadly, the quilt was lost in a house fire.

On the day of house fire, feeling terrible about the loss of her sister's home – and her quilt, Kerry went to Budding Star and got fabric for another Ocean Waves quilt for her sister. This one took ten years to finish as she raised her three children. During this time, she joined Courthouse Quilters but left after two years when she felt that she just couldn't give enough time to quilting or to the group.

Now that her youngest son has graduated from college and started his first job, she has found time for quilting in her empty nest. She loves to try new things and finds that she is evolving toward more Intricate patterns.

A chemist, she enjoys working with kits, seeing how complicated patterns are constructed, and recognizing the "engineering" side of quilting. She still appreciates traditional blocks but loves learning new techniques.



Having spent years making two quilts for her older sister, Kerry felt that she had short-changed her younger two sisters, but she had a plan. Every year the four sisters meet in a different city, and this year was in Bend, Oregon. The trip was scheduled so that they could to go to the quilt show in Sisters. Without telling her sisters, Kerry made and entered two quilts in the show. As her sisters saw them hanging there, she let them know that she had made the quilts for them.



When she isn't working or sewing, Kerry loves to cook. Her husband is a musician, and she enjoys going to his gigs and listening to jazz.

A Courthouse Quilters Exhibit at the Lebanon Township Museum

At our May meeting, the membership approved an invitation from the Lebanon Township Museum to create an exhibit of quilts celebrating the 100th anniversary of Women's Suffrage in the United States. In 1920, the U.S. passed the 19th Amendment giving women the right to vote. New Jersey passed the amendment in February 1920, so the museum curator would like to display our quilts for the month of February 2020.

Here are the details:

- Quilts will be displayed at the museum for the month of February 2020.
- Maximum size: 48"x48", no minimum.
- Not a competition. All quilts must be completed by the guild meeting on December 8, 2019. They will be shared in the Show & Tell at that meeting.



• You may make as many as you like, but put them in priority order.

There are many sources of inspiration for making a quilt with the suffrage theme.

- You might chose to focus on color. Gold was chosen as the color to represent Women's Suffrage. Shades range from buttercup to cheddar.
- You might chose to make one or more of the many blocks that were created to represent Women's Suffrage.
- You might chose to look through old photos of the suffragettes and print them on fabric or recreate them in fabric.
- You might chose to use a slogan from the time.



• You might chose an art deco theme – very popular 100 years ago.

• Of course, you may already be inspired and have something in mind.

The rooms have Jack and Jill bathrooms, A deposit of \$60 is required to hold your spot with the remainder due in mid-July.

The sewing room is well lit and has windows on two sides making it very bright. Each attendee get an 8' table for themselves and there are separate ironing and cutting stations in the room. The kitchen is extremely well stocked and the outdoor area is idyllic. The retreat house is less than a mile from Burkholder's Fabric, the largest quilt shop in Lancaster County.
