# Health & Nutrition corner

by Amy Gilman – Registered Dietitian Nutritionist (R.D.N.) The cold weather and an early sunset during the winter brings up a question to many parents – What are we going to do with these kids today? Here is a healthy snack that is fun for cold, snowy days when you're stuck inside.

## Frosted Apple Donuts (superkidsnutrition.com)

The base of this recipe is apples. Apples are packed with fiber, which is important for heart health at any age. Apple skins are also a good source of quercetin, a plant compound that is a phytochemical, which helps fight off disease. Quercetin helps protects us against asthma and appears to be important for memory and brain health.

Don't be intimidated by the beet juice ingredient! You can buy vacuumed sealed beets at Trader Joes. Use the liquid from the package and it will be more than enough to color your yogurt. You can also make and freeze beet juice in ice cube trays for later use if you want to try this recipe a different day, or even as a natural food dye for other dishes.

## Ingredients:

- 1 large apple
- 4 tablespoons 0% plain greek yogurt mixed with 1 teaspoon of honey
- 1-2 teaspoons 100% beet juice
- Diced strawberries
- Chocolate chips
- Unsweetened shredded coconut
- Granola

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Core and slice apple cross-wise into 4, 1/4" thick 1/4 slices
- Combine yogurt and 1 teaspoon of beet juice in a small bowl -add more beet juice if you want frosting to be a deeper pink color
- 3. Spread 1 tablespoon of the pink yogurt frosting onto each apple slice then lightly drip with honey
- 4. Top each "donut" with strawberries, chocolate chips, coconut, or granola
