Tunis Shriners Ottawa Wreath Laying Ceremony



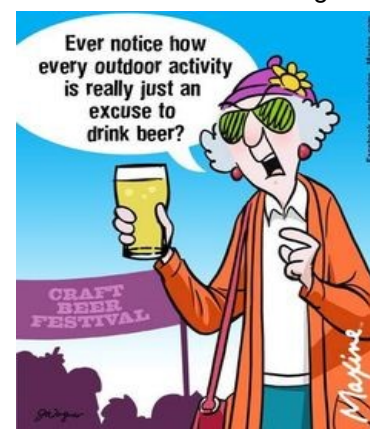

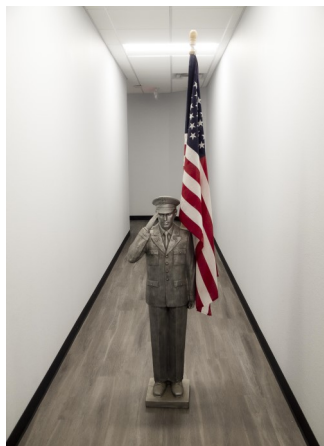
