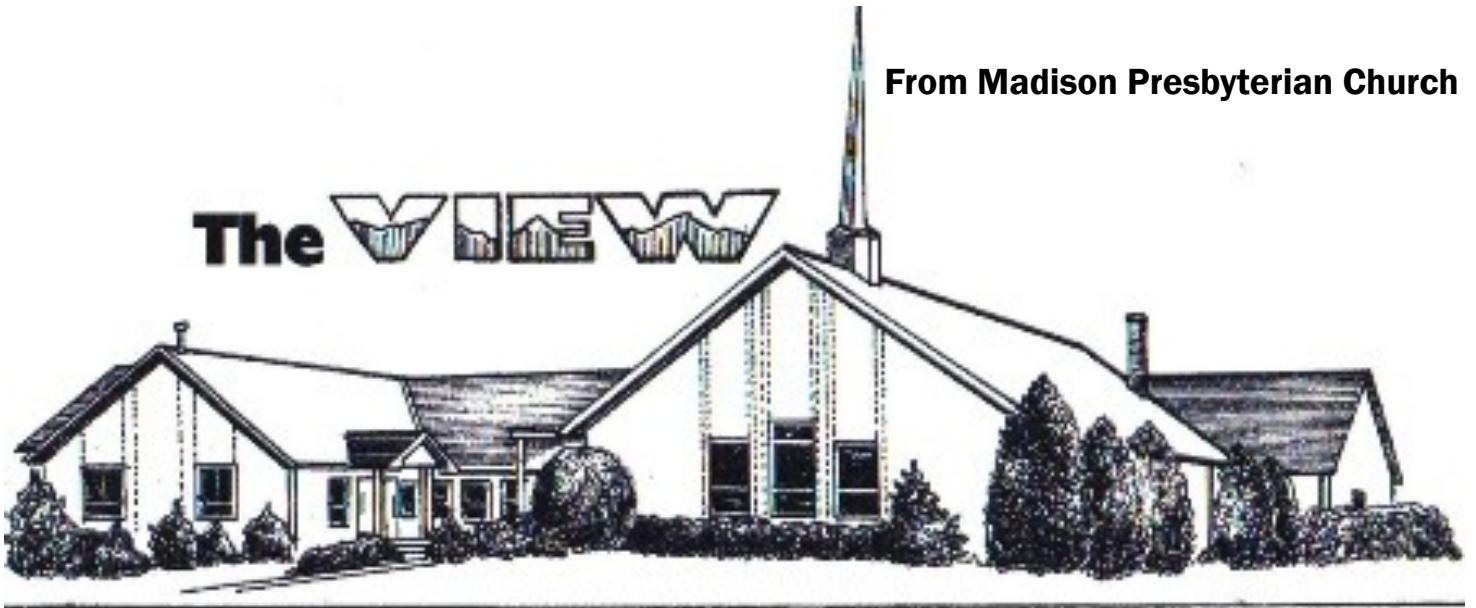

Treasurer's Report

The April financial report totals for income and spending were as follows:

Bill Pattie made the motion to give \$100 to Hunters to the Hungry to help pay for deer meat processing. Kim Barnes seconded the motion.

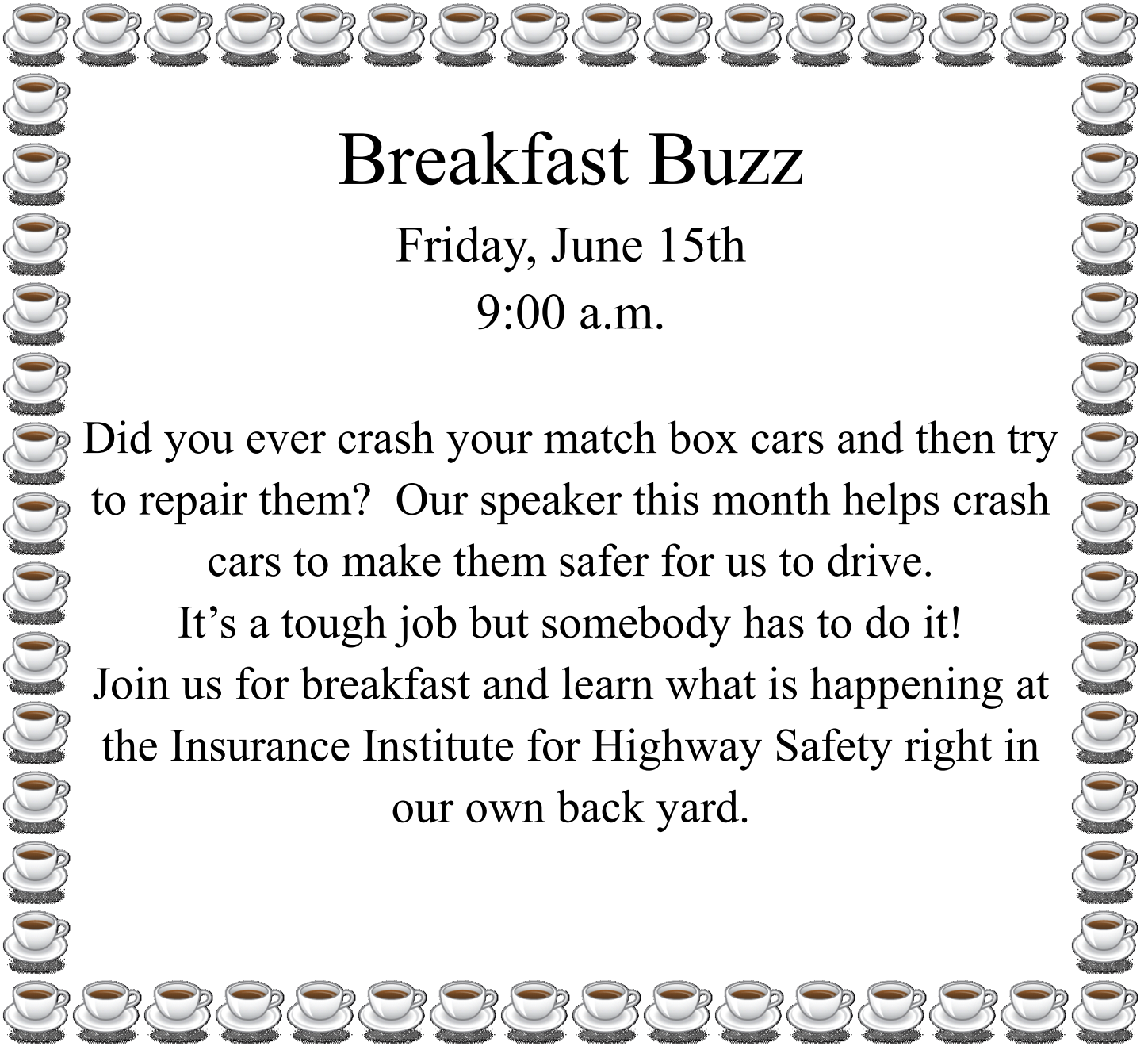


"Cook Out / Eat In"
