## The Road To Happy Destiny:

My name is Joe, and I'm an alcoholic. I am eternally grateful for the Road to Hope for offering me an opportunity that forever changed my life. I had been homeless for nearly 2 consecutive years, living in the woods, baseball dugouts, abandoned facilities and the like, and suffering from mental illness and alcoholism/ chemical dependency. Although I had no money to my name and could not find work, the Road to Hope took me in off the streets and out of the cold. They saved my life. But more than that, they introduced me to a solution to all my problems when, as much as I tried, I couldn't find any. Things were pretty bad then. But they weren't always.

I grew up in an affluent community and succeeded in academics and athletics. I took all honors or advanced placement courses in high school and played baseball at the collegiate level. I had a very good life and a very promising future. But at 20 years old I began drinking. Socially at first, however it didn't end up that way. Within a couple years I became an IV heroin user and was diagnosed with schizophrenia.

With great love and tolerance, the Road to Hope offered me the emotional support I needed to get on the path to recovery. All I had hoped for was warmth and shelter, but what I got was so much more. An atheist when I moved in, they talked of God and let rent slide for the first few months until they helped me find a job. I don't know how they could afford to that (and perhaps they didn't know either) and I didn't understand why. I did appreciate it though. It was at the Road to Hope I experienced brotherhood and witnessed something greater than myself making lives better.

Given my severe chemical dependency problem, they introduced me to a 12-step program and encouraged my involvement in it. For a total of about 11 months, I lived at both Hope House 1 and House 2. Day to day living there felt like being at a 12-step meeting at all times. The exposure to the solution and their support was crucial to obtaining the success I experience today. The Road to Hope also showed me stability. Knowing all too well the dilemma of 'how will I get my next meal?' and 'where will I sleep tonight?,' I cherish stability today. Having been a taker and done harm to my community during active addiction, the Road to Hope helped me re-enter the community as a productive member. They also showed me the power of giving. Today I find that its in giving that I receive the most.

I am now 25 years old with over 2 years of sobriety. I've held the same job for the last 2 years and have been promoted. I will be resuming school soon to finish my degree. After having been prescribed psychiatric medication for 6 years, I was taken off them by my doctor 2 years ago and have been symptom free since. The Road to Hope played an instrumental role in my recovery and I'm so thankful to them. They supported me and showed me how to live. Today I am able to be an example and an inspiration to those suffering to work with them like the Road to Hope worked with me. I am able to be a good person and a productive member of society today. The life I have today, at one time, seemed impossible. I believe miracles happen at the Road To Hope.

## The Road to Hope Inc. Purpose

The Hope House was created in response to the growing need for a structured residential facility with a supportive environment as alcoholism/chemical dependency continues to grow in epidemic progression among our local population. We believe that alcoholism/chemical dependency is a progressive illness that is activated by a combination of genetic predisposition and environmental circumstances. Once activated, there is a high probability that alcoholism and chemical dependency will prove fatal without help. In even the least severe addictions, alcoholism and chemical dependency exacts enormous costs to those actively addicted, those co-dependent upon the addicted person and the general public, which is victimized by the dangers and social costs presented by the addict. We exist to provide a cost-effective housing solution to help isolate our residents from dysfunctional living environments and to create an atmosphere guided and espoused by all Twelve Step programs

## **OUR MISSION STATEMENT:**

The Road to Hope Inc. is a drug and alcohol free, residential facility currently located in Lorain County, Ohio.

The goal of The Road to Hope is to provide an abstinence-based, Twelve Step environment within which the addicted person receives the support, guidance and faith necessary to become a productive member of our society, while living in accordance with a regimen of daily sobriety.

Personal Responsibility is at the heart of our program.

Our residents are required to have a sponsor, attend AA meetings and are charged a nominal monthly fee, but must be gainfully employed and able to pay their way.

The expectation is that our residents develop and hone the discipline and attributes necessary to successfully integrate back into the community and leave our facility after a relatively short period of time.

Our successful residents re-integrate happier, healthier, motivated and committed to the Twelve Step way of life as they return to their families, society and into the active Twelve Step community.
