<u>Approval of Minutes</u> – A motion was made by Scott Cirksena, seconded by Karen Novak-Swalwell for approval of the minutes of the following meetings: CIRDWC July 25, 2017; Technical Advisory Committee August 9, 2017; Technical Advisory Committee September 21, 2017. Motion passed.

<u>Financial Statements</u> – Vern Willey noted the ending balance for first quarter 2017–2018 is \$65,547.75. A motion was made by Cirksena and seconded by Karen Novak-Swalwell to approve the first quarter 2017-2018 financial statements. Motion passed.

Central Iowa Regional Water Update – Jason Mumm, FCS Group, provided an overview of the iterative process to date. Two workshops have been held, and bi-weekly public hearings are held at Urbandale City Hall on Wednesday mornings at 7:30 a.m. All meeting agenda, minutes, presentations, etc. are maintained at <a href="https://www.cirdwc.com">www.cirdwc.com</a>, and on Urbandale, WDMWW, and DMWW utility websites. The working group has gained consensus on several issues, and other issues remain to be discussed and resolved. The outcome or deliverable from the discussions is a 28F intergovernmental agreement at the end of 2017

Susan Huppert emphasized the public is invited and input is welcome throughout the process.

Technical Advisory Subcommittee Update – Amy Kahler provided an update on activities of the Technical Advisory Subcommittee. Mark Duben, HDR, attended the August meeting to answer questions related to DMWW's Long Range Plan. In September, Peggy Freese provided an overview of DMWW's 2016 Cost of Service results. The next Technical Advisory Subcommittee meeting is scheduled for November 16, 2017.

Executive Committee Report — Hosts for the 2018 CIRDWC meetings were selected: January 24, 2018, DMWW; April 24, 2018 — Johnston; July 24, 2018 — Urbandale Water Utility; October 23, 2018 — Atloona. Jim McKenna asked for volunteers to serve on the nominating committee to nominate 2018 officers and asked that any representative interested in serving on the Nominating Committee let him know before January.

<u>General Discussion</u> – There were questions and comments of support from public members in attendance related to regionalization and water quality efforts.

<u>Adjournment</u> – John McCune motioned for adjournment, seconded by Scott Cirksena. Meeting adjourned by unanimous consent at 6:54 p.m.

#### **Future Discussions and Interests of Technical Advisory Committee**

Ted Corrigan reviewed the accomplishments of the Technical Advisory Committee since 2015 and led a discussion on next steps for the Technical Advisory Committee. General consensus of the group was that there is interest in continuing to meet. It was suggested the committee dive a little deeper into the 2040 Long Range Plan to better understand Core Network projects, how those projects will be coordinated, and what costs will be assigned to various communities. It was suggested committee members share their own 5-year CIP plans with the group so there could be coordination among members.

#### **Regional Governance Update**

Ted Corrigan, Diana Wilson, and Dale Acheson updated the group on regionalization discussions. There are difficulties associated with forming a regional utility under 28F if the production assets remain with the original asset owners. The guiding principle stating "assets will not be transferred" has been suspended and recent discussions have contemplated asset transfer. There have been discussions on whether transferred assets would be just a portion of the Core Network (i.e, McMullen and Saylorville Water Treatment Plants), the entire Core Network, or all regional production assets (i.e., including other regional production such as West Des Moines Water Works, Altoona, etc.). Jason Mumm, facilitator from FCS Group, continues to lead discussions. The ultimate timing and outcome of the discussions is unknown at this time.

#### **CIRDWC Representatives:**

In January of each year, the Nominating Committee provides a slate of officers from among CIRDWC Representatives to be considered for election. Section 7 of the Bylaws provides:

CIRDWC Officers shall be elected annually during January by the Governing Board from among Representatives of Governing Members appointed to serve on CIRDWC. No such CIRDWC Officer shall be eligible for election to serve more than two full and consecutive terms in a particular office. Such Officers shall serve from February through January, but Officers shall hold office until successors for their office have been duly elected.
