What's New in the Pantry...

We have opened our doors and bread boxes to clients from the Divine Mercy Food Pantry in Central Square; inviting their clients to partake in our bread mission during pantry hours. We have a surplus of bread on hand and are in a position to share with our neighbors to the north. Thanks to the Food Bank of CNY and Panera Bread on Route 31 and Route 11, we receive a variety of bread and bakery items every week. OPEN tables have been allocated to accommodate guests and a special RESERVED FOR Brewerton Food Pantry Client Only table has been created to ensure that our local pantry clients continue to receive an assortment of baked goods and other items as part of their pantry experience. Our "bread left over's" will continue to help the Farmers on Gildner Road feed their pigs and other animals.

Our volunteers were represented at the 28th Annual Partner Agency Conference sponsored by the Food Bank of CNY that was held on June 7th. The day was filled with a series of thought provoking workshops with topics ranging from "Heating on a Budget," "One Person Can Make a Difference and Everyone Should Try" to "Little Changes, Big Impacts" and "Hunger at Your Doorstep." Time was also spent reconnecting and networking with food pantry coordinators & staff from the 11 Counties supported by the Food Bank, as well as the Food Bank staff. Our Keynote Speaker was John Tumino, Founder of In My Father's Kitchen, who turned his chef skills and life focus from running a successful restaurant in downtown Syracuse, to preparing "gourmet meals to go" serving the homeless. He recognized that people in need often feel invisible and alone, he wanted them to know that they were important. He built relationships through his food containers but his message went much deeper. Through his regular visit, he brought HOPE and TRUST to those he touched. Now, many of his clients are now paying it forward by reaching out to others in need.

He stressed that while food comes in containers, we ALL are containers with the ability to bring ourselves; our care & compassion to those who may feel invisible and insignificant. What a POWERFUL message as we are reminded of what our mission and focus should be as we reach out to those in need.

We received bountiful blessings in the form of a Food Grant & Operations Support Grant from the Food Bank of CNY. We were awarded \$3,320 in funding toward the purchase of food from the Food Bank and another \$1,551 to enhance our equipment through the purchase of a commercial freezer, 2 plastic utility carts and a hand truck. All the items have been purchased and are a welcome addition to our food pantry operation; helping to keep the pantry running efficiently and effectively. With the purchase of the new freezer, we are now able to donate the "red" upright freezer to the church for special projects, such as the Apple Fest, dinners, Thanksgiving turkeys, etc.

We recently were visited by Chris Smith, the Onondaga County Agency Relations Coordinator for the Food Bank of CNY. He performed a surprise inspection of our pantry and reviewed our practices. We were found to be in complete compliance and given an A+ rating.

We've had an amazing team of middle & high school students working alongside us all summer; earning their community service hours while experiencing what it means and how it feels to give back. Their youthful enthusiasm and energy filled the pantry as they worked alongside our veteran volunteers; building relationships along the way. They are our future and they are learning at a young age what it means to make a difference in our community by helping those in need.

In late August we said good-bye to Amy Gardner as she begins a new chapter in her life; beginning her freshman year at LeMoyne college. Amy began volunteering with her mom Pam, the summer of 2012 as she entered the 8th Grade and has volunteered over 225 hours; working every Thursday in the food pantry and also assisting with Vacation Bible School. She will be missed but never forgotten. Congratulations to Amy for graduating with Academic high honors but more importantly for earning the Presidential Service Award for her dedication and devotion to making the world a better place. We know she will accomplish great things and we are blessed to have worked with her all these years. She has promised to come back during breaks. In her honor, we have affectionately named our NEW, BIG Blue Hand Truck – "The Amy!" She will always be with us in spirit!

Thank you for your continued support of our food pantry mission. Together we are making a difference in the lives of MANY – clients and volunteers, alike!
