



In Him

To our Father in heaven and all of His family, all our brothers and sisters in Christ Jesus, all those who were once far off who have been made near by the blood of Christ (Eph. 2:13), all those that are sanctified by faith (Acts 26:18), and have elected for the sanctification of the spirit, for obedience and for the sprinkling of the blood of Christ Jesus (1 Peter 1:2). But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation. His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light (1 Pet 2:9), chosen by God and precious (1 Pet 2:4), a special treasure to God (Ex. 19:5). In Him who is true (1 John 5:20), Jesus Christ, we give thanks to the Lord, the living God, the true God, the everlasting King (Jer. 10:10), our righteous Father (John 17:25), for you and your family, for the saints, for the leaders that God has raised up on your behalf and for all men (1 Tim. 2:1-2). Mercy, peace, and love be multiplied to you. (Jude 1:2) Beloved, we pray that you may prosper in all things and be in health, just as your soul prospers. (3 John 1:2) But now in Christ Jesus, we who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ. (Eph. 2:13) We wait patiently for the Lord; and He inclines to us, and hears our cry (Ps. 40:1). And we know that the Son of God has come and has given us an understanding, that we may know Him who is true; and we are in Him who is true, in His Son Jesus Christ. This is the true God and eternal life. (1 John 5:20)

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be Your name. Your kingdom come. Your will be done on earth as it is in heaven. (Matt. 6:9-10) As an ambassador of Christ (2 Cor. 5:20), abiding in Christ (John 15:4-5, John 6:56) and one with Him (John 17:22), we come into agreement with our Father in heaven (Matt. 6:9), the Spirit of Truth (John

14:17) and the Word of Life (1 John 1:1). As a vessel of mercy, so that Christ might make known to you and your family the riches of His glory, we go up into the gaps to stand in battle on the day of the Lord, to build a wall for you and your house (Ezek. 13:5); for all the brethren, all those called by the name of the Lord; for the leaders of this nation, and all the leaders throughout the world, all those that influence the well being of God's people; all the people of this nation, and all men, so that you and your family may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence. (1 Tim. 2:1-2) In the name of Jesus Christ, we proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord, and the day of vengeance of our God (Is. 61:2). We stand, and rejoice in the hope of the glory of God! (Rom. 5:2) It is written (Matt. 4:4), the things that we speak (Jer. 1:7) and pray for you and your family (James 5:16), for these words are true and faithful (Rev. 21:5), and they are the true sayings of God (Rev. 19:9). The word of God is true (John 3:33), pure (Prov. 30:5, Ps. 119:140), proven (Ps. 18:30), and eternal, for heaven and earth will pass away, but God's word will by no means pass away (Matt. 24:35); it is living, and powerful (Heb. 4:12); it searches the hearts of man (Rev. 2:23), like a two edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart (Heb. 4:12), and nothing is hidden from His sight (Heb. 4:13), the Mighty One (Ps. 45:3), the Ancient of Days (Dan. 7:9), the Holy one of Israel (Is. 5:24). The words that Christ, through us, speaks to you and your family are spirit, and they are life. (John 6:63) Thanks be to God, who gives you the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Cor. 15:57)

In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth (John 16:23), by the precious blood of Christ, as of a lamb without blemish and without spot (1 Pet. 1:19), the Father in heaven bless you and your house and keep you (Num. 6:24). The Lord make His face shine upon you, and be gracious to you; the Lord lift up His countenance upon you, and give you peace. The Lord put His name on you and your

children and bless you and your house. (Num. 6:24:27) Glory to God the Father! (Luke 2:14) We don't come to the Father based on our own worthiness or on the worthiness of you and your family, but by Jesus Christ, whose sandal strap we are not worthy to loose. (John 1:27) As a fellow worker in Christ Jesus (Rom. 16:3), abiding in Him (John 15:4-5) and one with Him (John 17:22), we come before God's mercy seat on the merits of His Son, Jesus Christ, and the precious blood that He shed (1 Pet. 1:19), for worthy is the lamb who was slain to receive power and riches and wisdom and strength and honor and glory and blessing (Rev 5:12)! As a chosen vessel of Jesus Christ, to bear His name (Acts 9:15), so that Christ might make known to you the riches of His glory (Rom. 9:23), in His name (John 16:23) we come boldly to the throne of grace and obtain mercy and find grace (Heb. 4:16) for you and your entire house, all of your people, on every side, all of your family, all of your blood from the beginning of time until the end of time, all those by adoption, and all those by marriage, all your natural seed and all of your spiritual seed. Now this is the confidence that we have in Him, that if we ask anything according to His will, He hears us. And if we know that He hears us, whatever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we have asked of Him. (1 John 5:14-15) Oh, give thanks to the Lord, for He is good! Because His mercy endures forever. (Ps. 118:1)

In the name of Jesus Christ, who gave Himself for us, that He might purify for Himself His own special people, zealous for good works (Titus 2:14), in Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you and your family will come to Jesus Christ, the bread of life, and believe in Him and never hunger and never thirst. (John 6:35) Let you and your family believe that Jesus Christ is the resurrection and the life (John 11:25), knowing that you shall never die (John 11:26), though you may die, you shall live (John 11:25). As the word says you shall not abide in darkness (John 12:46), but abide

in Christ and have peace and be of good cheer (John 16:33). For through Him, believing in Him, you will receive remission of sins (Acts 10:43). May God perhaps grant you and your people repentance, so that you may know the truth (2 Tim. 2:25-26); open your eyes and turn you from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan to God (Acts 26:1), that you may come to your senses and escape the snare of the devil (2 Tim. 2:25-26); that you may receive forgiveness of sins and an inheritance among those who are sanctified by faith in Jesus Christ (Acts 26:1). Knowing that He, Jesus Christ, was manifested to take away your sins, and in Him there is no sin. (1 John 3:5) Having this hope in Him, let you and your people purify yourselves, just as He is pure (1 John 3:3), for He who abides in Him ought himself also to walk just as He walked (1 John 2:6). Now thanks be to God who always leads us in triumph in Christ, and through us diffuses the fragrance of His knowledge in every place. (2 Cor. 2:14) Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!

Whoever abides in Him, Jesus Christ, does not sin (1 John 3:6), but keeps His commandments (1 John 3:24). In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you and your family love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength, (Mark 12:30-31), with all your might, (Duet. 6:5), and with all your body (Rom. 12:12). We beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. (Rom. 12:1) And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God. (Rom. 12:2) For the temple of God is holy, which temple you are. (1 Co. 3:17) Or do you not know that your body is the temple of the Holy Spirit who is in you, whom you have from God, and you are not your own? For you were bought at a price; therefore

glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's. (1 Cor. 6:19-20) Let you and your family love your neighbor as yourself (Mark 12:30-31) and love one another; as Christ has loved you, walking in love, as Christ also has loved you and given himself for you, an offering and a sacrifice to God, as a sweet smelling aroma (Eph. 5:2). By this all will know that you are His disciples (John 13:35), His friends (John 15:14), that He has come to you (John 14:18), that you are the temple of the living God and He dwells in you (2 Cor. 6:13) that Christ dwells in your heart (Eph. 3:17), and that He has chosen you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain (John 15:16). In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we implore you and your people to keep His commandments, keep His word, abide in His love (John 15:10), and receive the Helper, the Holy Spirit (John 14:26), the Spirit of Truth (John 14:17), and both Jesus Christ and His Father will come and make their home with you (John 14:23). Let His commandment of love (John 13:34) be true in Him and in you also, because the darkness is passing away, and the true light is already shining (1 John 2:8). By this you shall know that you abide in Him, and He in you, because He has given you of His Spirit. (1 John 4:13) Let you and your family confess that Jesus is the Son of God, for it is written: "Whoever confesses that Jesus is the Son of God, God abides in him, and he in God. (1 John 4:15) In Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we also pray that you and your family confess Jesus Christ before men, so that He will also confess you before His Father who is in heaven. (Matt. 10:32) And now, may you and your house, abide in Him, that when He appears, you may have confidence and not be ashamed before Him at His coming. (1 John 2:28) Let you and your house abide in the light, and there shall be no cause for stumbling in you and your people (1 John 2:10). This is the message which we have heard from Him and declare to you, that God is light and in Him is no darkness at all. (1 John 1:5) Blessed are You, Lord God of Israel, our Father, forever and ever. (1 Chr. 29:10)

In the name of *Jesus Christ*, through whom also you have access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God (Rom. 5:2), we ask our heavenly Father to grant you ears (Rev. 2:7) to hear the unsearchable riches of *Christ* (Eph. 3:8), and to see what is the fellowship of the mystery of *Christ* (Eph. 3:9), so that you and your family may receive *Christ Jesus* the Lord (Col. 1:19) into your heart. According to the eternal purpose (Eph 3:1) it has been granted to you and yours, on behalf of *Christ*, to believe in Him (Phi. 1:29), *Jesus Christ*, in whom you have boldness and access with confidence through faith in Him to God Almighty (Eph. 3:11-12). May you and your family trust in *Jesus Christ*, hear and believe the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation; believing and being sealed with the Holy Spirit of promise, who is the guarantee of your inheritance until the redemption of the purchased possession (you), to the praise of His glory. (Eph. 1:13-14) In *Christ* (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you and all of your family will count all things loss for the excellence of the knowledge of *Christ Jesus* your Lord, for whom you will gladly suffer all the loss of all things, and count them as rubbish, that you may gain *Christ* and be found in Him, not having your own righteousness, but that which is through faith in *Christ*, the righteousness which is from God by faith; that you may truly know Him and the power of His resurrection, and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death, and attaining the resurrection from the dead (Phil. 3:8-11), becoming a new creation in Christ (2 Cor. 5:17). For we who live are always delivered to death for *Jesus'* sake, that the life of *Jesus* also may be manifested in our mortal flesh. (2 Cor. 4:11) For in Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead bodily; and you are complete in Him, who is the head of all principality and power. In Him we pray you will be circumcised by the circumcision of *Christ*, by putting off the body of the sins of the flesh, being buried with Him in

baptism, in which you also are raised with Him through faith in the working of God, who raised Him from the dead. (Col. 2:11-12) Having been crucified with Christ; it is no longer you who live, but Christ lives in you; and the life which you now live in the flesh, in Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray you live by faith in the Son of God, who loved you and gave Himself for you. (Gal. 2:20) As you have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, let you and your people walk in Him, rooted and built up in Him and established in the faith, abounding in it with thanksgiving. (Col. 2:6-7) The Lord is your strength and song, and He has become your salvation. Let the voice of rejoicing and salvation be in your house; the right hand of the Lord does valiantly. The right hand of the Lord is exalted; the right hand of the Lord does valiantly. (Ps. 118:14-16)

In the name of Jesus Christ, for it pleased the Father that in Him all the fullness should dwell (Col. 1:19), blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed you and your house with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ, just as He chose you in Him before the foundation of the world, that you and your people should be holy and without blame before Him in love, having predestined you to adoption as sons by Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will, to the praise of the glory of His grace, by which He has made you and your family accepted in the Beloved. (Eph. 1:3-6) For all the promises of God in Him are Yes, and in Him Amen, to the glory of God through you and your house. (2 Cor. 1:20) For He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for you, that you and yours might become the righteousness of God in Him. (2 Cor. 5:21) For though He was crucified in weakness, yet He lives by the power of God. For you and your people also are weak in Him, but you shall live with Him by the power of God toward you. (2 Cor. 13:4) In Him, Jesus Christ, who was delivered up because of your offenses, and was

raised because of your justification (Rom. 4:20-25), you have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of His grace which He made to abound toward you and your house, in all wisdom and prudence, so that in the dispensation of the fullness of the times He might gather together in one you and your people with all things in Christ, both which are in heaven and which are on earth in Him, in whom also you and your people have obtained an inheritance, being predestined according to the purpose of Him who works all things according to the counsel of His will, that you who trust in Christ should be to the praise of His glory. (Eph. 1:7-12) For in Him, Jesus Christ, let you and your family live and move and have your being saying "For we are also His offspring." (Acts 17:28) "We will put our trust in Him" knowing that you are the children whom God has given to Jesus Christ (Heb. 2:13), you are His inheritance (Eph. 1:18), you are redeemed by His blood (Eph. 1:7). You are not your own, but have been bought with a price (1 Cor. 6:20), the precious blood of the Christ (1 Pet. 1:19). Let you and your house be among those who come out of the great tribulation, and who wash their robes and make them white in the blood of the Lamb. (Rev. 7:14) You shall neither hunger anymore nor thirst anymore; the sun shall not strike you, nor any heat; for the Lamb who is in the midst of the throne will shepherd you and your house and lead you and your people to living fountains of waters. And God will wipe away every tear from your eyes. (Rev. 7:16-17) You are worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honor and power; for You created all things, and by Your will they exist and were created. (Rev. 4:11) Blessing and honor and glory and power be to Him who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb, forever and ever! (Rev. 5:13)

In the name of Jesus Christ, who abolished death, and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel (2 Tim. 1:10), in Christ (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray

that today you will know that *Jesus Christ* is in His Father (God Almighty), and you are in *Jesus Christ*, and *Jesus Christ* is in you (John 4:20), knowing that you abide in *Jesus Christ* and Him in you, being a fruit bearing branch, abiding in the vine of life (John 15:4) and bearing much fruit (John 15:5), being made perfect in one, and the world will know that God loves you, just as He loves *Jesus Christ*, His Son. (John 17:23) Being assured that the anointing which you have received from Him abides in you, and you do not need that anyone teach you; but as the same anointing teaches you concerning all things, and is true, and is not a lie, and just as it has taught you, you will abide in Him. (1 John 2:27) The Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father has given to you in the name of *Jesus Christ*, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all things (John 14:26) For your sake *Jesus Christ* sanctified Himself, that you also may be sanctified by the truth. (John 17:19) The promise of the new covenant is that our Mighty God will put His laws in your mind and write them on your heart; and He will be your God, and you shall be His people. None of you shall teach his neighbor, and none his brother, saying, 'Know the Lord,' for all shall know Him, from the least of you to the greatest of you. For He will be merciful to your unrighteousness, and your sins and your lawless deeds He will remember no more. (Heb. 8:10-12) In *Christ* (Rom. 9:1, 1 Cor. 1:30) we pray that you and your family will believe in *Jesus Christ* through the word, be sanctified by faith in *Christ* (Acts 26:18), that you all may be one, as God is in *Jesus Christ*, and *Jesus Christ* in God; that you also may be one in Them (John 17:19-21). Let you and your family abide in *Jesus Christ*, and His words abide in you so that you will ask what you desire, and it shall be done for you. (John 15:7) May you and your family glorify God for the obedience of your confession to the gospel of *Christ* (2 Cor. 9:13), glorifying God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's (1 Cor. 6:20). Thanks be to God for His indescribable gift! (2 Cor. 9:15)

It is written: "Most assuredly, I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do he will do also; and greater works than these he will do, because I go to My Father." (John 14:12) In the name of Jesus Christ, true and righteous are His judgments (Rev. 16:7), in Christ we pray that you are a fellow worker in Christ Jesus (Rom. 16:3), an ambassador of Christ (2 Cor. 5:20), a fellow worker for the Truth (3 John 1:8), abiding in Him, and born of Him (1 John 2:29), and one with Him (John 17:22). In Christ we pray you are a chosen vessel of Jesus Christ, to bear His name (Acts 9:15), a vessel of honor (Rom. 9:21), a vessel of ministry (Heb. 9:21), a vessel of mercy, so that Christ might make known through you the riches of His glory (Rom. 9:23), aiding in God and abiding in His love (1 John 4:16), and His love being perfected in you (1 John 4:12). Believing and abiding in (John 15:4-5) Jesus Christ, out of your heart will flow rivers of living water. (John 6:56) Therefore we also pray always for you that our God would count you worthy of this calling, and fulfill all the good pleasure of His goodness and the work of faith with power, that the name of our Lord Jesus Christ may be glorified in you, and you in Him, according to the grace of our God and the Lord Jesus Christ. (2 Thess. 1:11-12) To you and your people, let it be granted to be arrayed in fine linen, clean and bright, for the fine linen is the righteous acts of the saints. May you and your house be blessed, may you and your family be called to the marriage supper of the Lamb! Let us be glad and rejoice and give Him glory, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and you and yours have made yourself ready. (Rev. 19:7-9)

Since you are in Christ, by the grace of God you have been justified, completely forgiven and made righteous (Rom. 5:1), having died to sin (Rom. 6:2), no longer being a slave to sin (Rom. 5:6) but walking in the newness of life (Rom. 5:4), having been set free from condemnation (Rom. 8:1), receiving the Spirit who is from God, that you might know the things that have been freely given to you by God

(1 Cor. 2:12). Now He who establishes you in Christ and has anointed you is God, who also has sealed you and given you the Spirit in your hearts as a deposit (2 Cor. 1:21-22). Even when you were dead in trespasses, He made you alive together with Christ (Eph. 2:5) and raised you up together, and made you sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus (Eph. 2:6), delivering you from the power of darkness and translating you into the kingdom of the Son of His love (Col 1:13), having saved you and called you with a holy calling, not according to your works, but according to His own purpose and grace which was given to you in Christ Jesus before time began (2 Tim. 1:9). Not by works of righteousness which you have done, but according to His mercy He saved you, through the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on you abundantly through Jesus Christ your Savior, that having been justified by His grace you should become heirs according to the hope of eternal life (Titus 3:5-7) as His divine power has given to you all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called you by glory and virtue, by which have been given to you exceedingly great and precious promises, that through these you may be partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world through lust. (2 Pet. 1:3-4) For you do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with your weaknesses (Heb. 4:15-16). For both He who sanctifies and those who are being sanctified are all of one, for which reason He is not ashamed to call you brethren, (Heb 2:11)

As a fellow worker for the Truth (3 John 1:8), abiding in the Son and the Father (John 2:24), and one with Them (John 17:22), in truth (John 17:19) we sanctify (1 John 17:17, 19, Heb. 13:12) you and your family, your time and your space, by the blood of the lamb (Rev. 7:14, 12:11). Our Lord and Savior (2 Pet. 1:11), Jesus Christ, to Him was given dominion and glory and a kingdom, that all peoples, nations, and languages should serve

Him. His dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and His kingdom the one which shall not be destroyed. The earth is the Lords, and all its fullness, the world and those who dwell therein. (Ps. 24:1) The heavens are His, the earth also is His; the world and all its fullness, He has founded it. The north and the south, the east and the west, He has created it. For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers. All things were created through Him and for Him. (Col. 1:16) You are worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honor and power; for You created all things, and by Your will they exist and were created. (Rev. 4:11) As a fellow worker in Christ, a fellow-worker of God (1 Cor. 3:9), abiding in Him, and born of Him (1 John 2:29), and His love being perfected in us (1 John 4:12), we proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord, and the day of vengeance of our God. As a vessel of mercy, so that Christ might make known to you the riches of His glory, we claim you and all the people of the earth as the inheritance (Eph. 1:18) of our Lord Jesus Christ. By the Ancient of Days, judgment was made in favor of the saints of the Most High, and the time has come for the saints to possess the kingdom. (Dan. 7:22) Awake, you who sleep, arise from the dead, and Christ will give you light; awake to righteousness, and do not sin. And do this, knowing the time, that now it is high time to awake out of sleep; for now our salvation is near. (Rom. 13:11) Come near, you nations, to hear; and heed, you people! Let the earth hear, and all that is in it, the world and all things that come forth from it. (Is. 34:1)

In Christ Jesus (Rom. 16:3), abiding in Him (John 15:4-5) and one with Him (John 17:22), our hearts are overflowing with love for you and your people. You are His own special people (1 Pet. 2:9), chosen by God and precious (1 Pet. 2:4), a special treasure to God (Ex. 19:5), and very precious to us. Concerning the things we pray for you and

your house, we come into agreement with you (Matt. 18:19), with our Father in heaven (Matt. 6:9), the Spirit of Truth (John 14:17), and the Word of Life (1 John 1:1), being of one accord in prayer (Acts 1:14), we ask with confidence (1 John 5:14), for God's thoughts towards you and your house are thoughts of peace, to give you a future and a hope (Jer. 29:11). We ask our Father in heaven, all things in the name of our Lord **Jesus Christ** (John 16:23), our advocate with the Father (1 John 2:1). Believing that you and your descendants receive all we ask for you (Mark 11:24), knowing that it is the will of God and He hears us (1 John 5:14). We continue to petition (1 John 5:15) fervently (James 5:16) the Lord to let it be to you and your descendants according to His word (Luke 1:38). What we have asked shall be given to you and your house (Luke 11:9). For it is written: "Ask of Me, and I will give You the nations for Your inheritance, and the ends of the earth for Your possession." (Ps. 2:8) The counsel of the Lord stands forever, the plans of His heart to all generations. (Ps. 33:11) God is watching over His word to perform it (Jer. 1:12); it shall not return to Him void; but it shall accomplish His purpose and succeed in the thing for which He sent it (Is. 55:11). "My covenant I will not break, nor alter the word that has gone out of My lips." Says the Lord God Almighty (Ps 89:34). In **Jesus'** name (John 16:23) so be it. You, O Lord, shall endure forever, and the remembrance of your name to all generations. (Ps. 102:12) We will declare Your name to Your brethren; in the midst of the congregation we will praise You. Let us fear the Lord, and praise Him! We and all of our descendants will glorify Him, and fear Him, we whom are the offspring of **Christ!** (Ps. 22:22-23) For Yours, O Lord, is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. (Matt. 6:13) Amen
