If you do find a tick (it may be very tiny or even look like a speck of dirt), remove it carefully with a tweezers by grabbing at the head and pull it out slowly and firmly.

While the chance of actually being infected with Lyme Disease is small, through education, you now know what to watch for if a tick bite occurs.

PARISH NURSE NEWS

Who knew! There is a national agency that predicts the severity of nuisance insects! The NPMA, (National Pest Management Association) is a non-profit organization with more than 7,000 members. Established in 1933, The NPMA supports the pest management industry's commitment to the protection of public health, food and property.

The National Pest Management Association (NPMA) releases its bi-annual Bug Barometer™, in time for the Spring/Summer and Fall/Winter seasons. This indicator of insect activity that Americans can expect to see in their respective regions of the country is based on weather patterns and pest biological behaviors.

The Spring/Summer forecast noted that ants would invade homes in the spring in search of water, since we had very little rain this spring. It was also noted, that when warm and humid weather arrived this summer, gnats, mosquitoes, and ticks would be out in full-force. (The NPMA was right, at least at my house. In early May I was battling ants in my kitchen, which is very unusual. Then came the gnats and mosquitoes with the last heat wave we had. We have already removed ticks from several family pets-all indoor dogs.)

Mosquitoes are bad enough, but ticks bring their own set of problems. Ticks carry bacteria that cause Lyme Disease, which affects humans and animals. The symptoms of Lyme Disease may include a red, circular rash (often called a bulls-eye rash) measuring the size of a quarter up to 10 inches across. If you notice you have this rash, visit your doctor right away. Immediate treatment can prevent worse symptoms such as flu-like symptoms, sensitivity to light, memory lapses, decreased concentration, overwhelming fatigue, heart palpitations, inflammation of the spinal cord and brain, night sweats, Bell's Palsy (facial paralysis), joint swelling, headaches, and muscle weakness. In short, tick bites are not good!

The best way to avoid getting Lyme Disease is to avoid tick bites. While in years past, we have been south of the worst areas for ticks (Minnesota and Wisconsin), the NPMA has included our area for increased tick activity. You can prevent tick bites by wearing long sleeves, hat and long pants, especially when you are in wooded areas, or even just "settin' a spell" under the tree in your back yard. Using an insect repellant that contains 10% to 30% DEET may

Following worship Pastor Becky will bless the animals you bring with you, giving thanks to God for the beauty of their creation and companionship in our lives.


You'll receive a certificate of blessing.

Watertown Food Pantry News

We really appreciate the many cash donations and the food we find in the cart. We especially want to thank Pat and Wanda White, the Noakes family, and all the rest of you who collectively donated 70+ lbs of hamburger from the Hy-Vee sale. It often involves multiple trips in and out of the store and we sure do appreciate your efforts and generosity.



During the month of May we helped 93 families which were composed of 182 adults and 125 children. It's amazing that we continue to add new families weekly. We currently have over 425 names in our database as the need continues to grow. Everyone we serve is thankful for the help and usually say so. We have heard "God bless you" many, many times and want you to know that you are a part of this ministry whether you donate time, food, money, or prayers. It's always interesting at the food pantry. **Please consider** a donation or volunteering for an afternoon shift. Our open hours are Tuesdays and Fridays from 1-4 pm. Both shifts include stocking shelves, inventorying donations, etc., as well as helping our 'clients' pick out the food they need.

Our ongoing needs aside from monetary donations are: plastic grocery bags, toilet paper, corn bread/muffin mix, any canned **fruit** or vegetables, canned **tuna**/ham/chicken, boxed dinner mixes, instant mashed potatoes, cereal – almost anything to make a meal. (We are currently loaded with green beans and creamed corn but can use any other vegetable). All food items must be within their "fresh date" per Churches United regulations. We use some of the cash donations to buy fresh milk and eggs. Bread products are donated by Silvis HyVee.

Again, thank you all for your support and prayers and please feel free to ask any of us questions you may have.






