

VILLAGE OF DRYDEN
FIRE CODE ORDINANCE
ORDINANCE NO. 48

An ordinance to prescribe minimum requirements and controls to safeguard life, property, or public welfare from the hazards of fire and explosion arising from the storage, handling and use of substances, materials, or devices and from conditions hazardous to life, property or public welfare in the use or occupancy of buildings, structures, sheds, tents, lots or premises; to provide for the issuance of permits, collection of fees, the making and frequency of inspections, provide for the appointment of a fire prevention official; and provide penalties for violations.

THE VILLAGE OF DRYDEN ORDAINS:

Section 1. ADOPTION OF THE FIRE PREVENTION CODES.

Pursuant to the authority of act 230 of 1972, the village does hereby adopt the "2006 International Fire Code" as published by the International Code Council, Inc. and all subsequent editions. All provisions, and terms of the International Fire code are hereby referred to, adopted and made a part hereof, as if fully set out in this ordinance.

Section 2. FEES

All fees for permits, bonds, or inspections required by the Code shall be established by motion of the Village Council.

Section 3. AVAILABILITY OF CODES.

A complete copy of the Codes shall be available for public use and inspection at the Village offices.

Section 4. FIRE PREVENTION OFFICIAL.

The Village Council shall appoint a qualified person to serve as the fire prevention official to exercise the authority granted in the Codes. The fire prevention official shall have the authority to administer and enforce the provisions of the International Fire Code and shall have the authority to issue civil infractions with reasonable cause to believe that a violation of the codes adopted by this ordinance has occurred.

Section 5. MINIMUM FREQUENCY OF INSPECTION.

Inspections pursuant to the International Fire Code shall be conducted on each premise (other than single family dwellings and buildings accessory to single family dwellings) at least once in a three year period.

Section 6. PENALTY.

Any person, persons, firm, or corporation convicted of violating any provision of Ordinance 48 is responsible for a municipal civil infraction, subject to payment of a civil infraction of not less than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, plus costs and other sanctions for each infraction. Repeat offenses under Ordinance 48 shall be subject to increased fines as provided for by Ordinance 96-001.

Section 7. REPEAL

Ordinance 47 and Ordinance 47.4 being an amendment to the Village of Dryden Fire Code Ordinance adopted April 1, 2002 are hereby repealed.

The undersigned President and Clerk of the Village of Dryden hereby certify that this ordinance was adopted by the Dryden Village Council at a meeting held on the 4th day of May 2010, and published in the LA View on the 13th day of May 2010.

This Ordinance is effective 20 days after said date of adoption.
