# INFORMATION FOR CURRENT 8 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ GRADE BAND STUDENTS AND PARENTS 

## The FACTS

- The NUMBERS say it all. At about 150 members, the Spartan Marching Band is the largest class, organization, performing group, or activity in which a student can be involved in the Boardman Schools.
- We are NATIONALLY RECOGNIZED! The award-winning BSMB, Wind Ensemble, and Jazz Ensembles and our reputation for excellence are wellknown throughout the state and the country.
- We offer the most AMAZING OPPORTUNITIES. Band and Jazz students have performed for a sitting U.S. President. They have performed at the Indy 500, the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, the Tournament of Roses Parade, the Citrus Bowl Parade, Disney World, B.B. King's Blues Club and Swing 46 in NYC, The Blue Wisp Jazz Club in Cincinnati, and many more. They have played for the Cleveland Indians, the Cleveland Cavaliers, the Pittsburgh Steelers, the Cleveland Browns, the Cincinnati Bengals, the Buffalo Bills, and more.
- COLLEGES KNOW US. Participation and achievement in the Band and Jazz Programs will give students an edge when applying for college and for scholarships.
- LOCAL BUSINESSES KNOW US. Employers often tell us that their best young employees are Boardman Band students because they have the best work ethic.
- BAND and JAZZ are FUN! Think about the numbers again. Students only need one fine arts credit to graduate. If it wasn't fun and worthwhile, they would drop out after their first year and the band would be no more than about 50 students.


## Did You Know?

- About 35\% of Band members also participate in BHS athletics each year. That INCLUDES varsity football and cheerleading.
- Band counts as a gym credit at BHS! Stay in Band and you'll never have to take a gym class in high school.
- You can also be in the BHS Symphony Orchestra as a woodwind, brass, or percussion player.
- Band members can also participate in the award-winning BHS Jazz Program, sports pep bands, small ensembles, $2 k x x$ Pop/Rock Band, and Pit Orchestra for the BHS Drama Guild's Fall Musical.
- Many of the top 100 seniors are in the Band.
- The Boardman Music Department is the recipient of a Grammy Award!
- $8^{\text {th }}$ Grade Band Members will get to march and perform with the high school band at the end of the year with a performance trip to Cedar Point AND the Memorial Day Parade here in Boardman.


## COMMON QUESTIONS ABOUT HIGH SCHOOL BAND MEMBERSHIP

## Is band just an extra-curricular activity?

No. Band is a class that meets every day during the school day. Students are graded and earn credits toward graduation. Band performances are considered co-curricular, thus grading procedures apply to all scheduled performances.

We do offer an extra-curricular component of marching band for Boardman students in good standing with the BGJHS or BHS Band Program IF they choose to attend MCCTC or STEM Academy.

## What class do I choose for my schedule?

Varsity Band is the name of the course for Band. It is a year-long course that includes summer practice, marching band, and concert band. BHS students may not enroll in marching band only or concert band only. Marching band begins in August and lasts through football season. When school starts, the entire band meets during $4^{\text {th }}$ period every day.

## Can anyone join Band?

Enrollment in the Boardman Band is open to high school students who have successfully participated in middle school band at least during $7^{\text {th }}$ and $8^{\text {th }}$ grade. Students who were not in $7^{\text {th }}$ and $8^{\text {th }}$ grade band must audition and be able to play at the same level or better than students their age.

## Do I have to Audition to be in Band?

Not to BE in Band, just to STAY in Band. Percussion students must audition to determine marching instrument placement. When we transition from marching band to concert band, all Band members must audition to determine chair placement. If a student does not turn in an audition, he or she will fail the class.

## Are there rehearsals after school?

We MAY schedule some after school rehearsals to accommodate any MCCTC or Stem band members, but we will inform you well in advance when possible. This means that you will still be able to participate in fall sports AND band.

The 2kxx Pop/Rock band practices 2 days a week right after school and the Drumline, Spartan Sweethearts, and Spartan Silks might schedule some after school practices.

## Is band going to take up too much of my time?

Band takes about as much time as any extra-curricular activity. Many students are concerned with the amount of time it will take at the beginning of the school year. That is our busy season. When marching season ends, band takes up considerably less time than any extra-curricular activity. Think of it this way - if band is such a timeconsuming burden, why is the Spartan Marching Band still the single largest organization at Boardman High School?

## Can I be in more than one music class?

Yes! A second music class like Jazz Ensemble 2 or Symphony Orchestra is available by recommendation or audition. We strongly encourage our $8^{\text {th }}$ Grade Jazz and Orchestra Winds students to continue these additional playing opportunities in high school. The directors and your Guidance Counselor can help you manage your schedule to accommodate multiple music classes.

## How am I going to balance my schedule; especially if I want more than one music class?

The Guidance Department suggests that students "backload" their schedules. That means to postpone scheduling some classes until junior or senior year. Most seniors find that their class load is too light and cannot find courses to fill up their schedule. The fact that marching band counts as gym credit really frees up your schedule.

Yes. In order to begin performing at band nights and football games before the start of the school year, it is essential to have rehearsals in the summer and attend Band Camp. Summer band consists of about two weeks of rehearsals at school, one week of Band Camp (sometimes away from school), and then a small number of rehearsals during the last weeks of August.

## What if my family is going on vacation in August?

We hope that you can plan vacations around the band schedule. If this is not possible, please contact the Band Staff to discuss options for working around the conflict. We would rather work out some arrangement than lose a good band member.

## How do I become a Spartan Sweetheart, Silk, or Twirler?

You can audition for these units after serving as a regular band member for one year. There are some other requirements including academic eligibility. These squads as well as Drum Major, Field Conductor, and Band Vocalist are ONLY available to regular band members (not to those participating in the extra-curricular portion of band).

## Does band conflict with athletics and cheerleading?

There have always been minor conflicts with various rehearsal and performance schedules. Our philosophy is that we would rather work out these conflicts than lose a good band member. Any conflict with fall sports will only last for the first quarter of the school year. Band lasts the whole school year. It seems ridiculous to drop the entire year over a 10 -week conflict. Students CAN participate in Football and Band. Football players may be excused from summer practice, Band Camp, and football game performances based on the recommendation of the coach. These students will be expected to practice with the band daily during the band period and participate in non-football game performances.

With all conflicts, we only expect consideration and professionalism. Compare your band schedule and other schedules as soon as you get them, then give us sufficient notice of any conflict.

## Does the band take a trip every year?

Yes! Part of the band's "Tradition of Excellence" comes from the many prestigious out-of-state performances in which the band has participated. The Boardman Band has achieved numerous honors and awards by appearing in the most famous parades and performance venues including the Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade, the Orange Bowl Parade, the Citrus Bowl Parade, America's Thanksgiving Parade, the Fiesta Bowl Parade, and the Tournament of Roses Parade. Traditionally, we try to alternate between a large trip and a small trip each year. In addition to the yearly band trip, we travel to Cedar point each May, and try to schedule an overnight trip for the Jazz Ensembles each year.

The performance integrity of the Band on a trip depends on each student's participation, so we hope that all students will go on the trip. HOWEVER, we cannot make band trips mandatory. Students will be given an opportunity to "opt out" of the trip at the beginning of each school year.

## Do the students raise money for the trips?

Students will be given many opportunities to participate in fundraising projects each year. Profits go toward lowering the cost of the trip for all students.

## Are private lessons required?

Private lessons are strongly recommended for all band students. Besides the benefit of individual instruction which the band staff doesn't have time to give, private instruction is one of the things that count toward students' grades.

## Can I be in Jazz Ensemble 1 or 2 if I am not in Band?

No. The only non-band students allowed in Jazz Ensembles 1 and 2 are those who play instruments not found in a marching band (piano, guitar, bass); and then, only if needed. We've been lucky recently to have band members who also play some of these instruments.

## Can I be in $\mathbf{2 k x x}$ ?

Yes, if you are in band and/or jazz. It will only be in rare circumstances that a non-band/jazz student will get into $2 k x x$. Extra-curricular band members are welcome to participate.

## Are there extra expenses for Band and Jazz?

There are some. Uniforms, accessories, Band Camp, banquets, and trips all cost money. Some things are optional. There is a page below called Fee Payment Structure. It contains last year's prices but it will give you a general idea of some of your starting costs.

## What is BBOP?

The Boardman Band and Orchestra Parents group is basically the parent booster group for Band and Orchestra. Besides raising money for uniforms, equipment, and anything else the Board of Education doesn't provide, BBOP provides chaperones for Band Camp, trips, games, etc. They also act as supporters and advocates of the Boardman Band and Orchestra Program. Help is always needed and appreciated; parents are encouraged to get involved.

## Director's Thoughts:

## For Students...

We are very eager to have every middle school band member continue with band through high school because it promises quality and worthwhile music education AND it continues to be one of the most fun activities at Boardman High School. We have so many students who were thinking about quitting band after $8^{\text {th }}$ grade but are glad they decided to stay. If you are not sure whether you want to continue, give it a try. In the year you use as your "trial period" you will perform exciting halftime shows and quality concerts, learn more music than you ever thought possible, and go on a great trip. Every Boardman High School student must have one credit in Fine Arts to graduate anyway. It might as well be Band since you have already been trained for it.

## For Parents...

The transition from junior high to high school can be stressful for students and parents. They wonder about the new friends they will meet and what types of new influences they will experience. Parents worry about their children's desire for more freedom and less supervision.

Band parents feel very safe knowing that their first interactions in high school are here with good band students, caring staff members, and nurturing parent chaperones. Your child's new social schedule will be filled with band events in August and through the fall. By the time our activities slow down and your child has more free time on the weekends, their circle of friends and activities will be well-established. You might even get to know their friends' parents through band.

## FEE PAYMENT STRUCTURE

When you come for Uniform Distribution, you can pay for lots of other things besides the uniform fee and items. To avoid bookkeeping confusion, we ask that you be prepared to write separate checks for various items. Use the following to figure out what you may need:

- Dinkles (marching shoes) - \$36
- Extra Band t-shirt - $\$ 10$ - if needed
- Band polo shirt (summer uniform) - \$16
- Long-sleeve Band t-shirt - \$15-optional
- Boardman Band knit hat - \$10-optional
- Head band - \$2-optional

2. Account Check

- Outstanding account balance - \$? - if needed (cashier at Distribution will have a list)
- General account payment/trip deposit - \$? - optional

3. Band Council Check

- Current year's Boardman Band Hoodie - \$25 - optional
- Senior T-shirt - \$18 - Seniors only, optional

4. Merchandise and Accessories Check

- Band Dude Water Jug - \$5-optional
- Band Dude Car Magnet - \$7 - optional
- Band Dude Sticker - \$1-optional


## Specific Information for 2024-2025

- Pre-Practice Sessions - Monday/Tuesday, July 15/16

These sessions in July are for our incoming freshmen, new Band members, and Section Leaders. They will get our newest band members acquainted with some basic marching skills and give a sneak peek at some of the music we will play in marching season.

- Mandatory Summer Practice

Every event from July 22 through the end of the school year is considered mandatory which means conflicts must be handled according to the Attendance/Grading Policy. Basically, students must request approval for missing a rehearsal or performance. Unexcused absences count against a student's grade. If you currently have a conflict with these dates, do not let it discourage you from signing up for band. Absences can be worked around if there is early communication with the band director.

* Traditionally, the band goes away to "band camp" during the third week of summer rehearsals. Band camp usually takes place at a university or summer camp facility. Band camp is one of the students' favorite parts of band!

- Marching Percussion Auditions - Tuesday, May 14, 2024

Percussion students must audition to determine instrument assignments in that section. Music and instructions will be given to students before the end of this school year. No late auditions will be allowed. A percussion student who does not audition will not be assigned an instrument in the percussion section. If the student stays in the class, he or she will be considered an alternate and will be used to fill in an empty spot when a student is absent.

- Student Accounts

Families of current $8^{\text {th }}$ grade band students are welcome to start building their child's high school band account. Send money to a director in the band office and it will be applied to your child's band account to use for uniform fees, the trip(s), and other events with a cost. Just make sure the student's name is on the check; especially if it does not match the name printed on the check.

- Band Trip for 2024-2025

The traditional rotation includes a trip each year and Florida once every four years. We try to alternate big trips (like Florida and Chicago) with small trips. Since we will have done a Florida trip in the 23-24 school year, next year's trip will be smaller and more affordable. Details will be available soon.

## BOARDMAN HIGH SCHOOL BAND COURSE OFFERINGS and DESCRIPTIONS

## THE BOARDMAN BANDS

Varsity Band Grades 9-12: both semesters, 1 credit. Includes both marching band and concert band. Prerequisite: previous year's participation in Boardman or audition.

Spartan Marching Band - The Spartan Marching Band is the representative marching unit of the Instrumental Music Department. The Band performs at all regularly scheduled Varsity football games, and various other events including, but not limited to: band festivals, pep rallies, community parades and events, college and professional football games, and national parades and events. The educational goals of marching band focus on coordinating physical movement with music, showmanship and entertainment value, performance etiquette and stage presence, and professional and life skills. The Spartan Marching Band may have as many as 25 performances in a school year.

Extra-Curricular Marching Band - Available to some MCCTC and STEM Academy students ONLY. Students who are in good standing in the BGJHS Band or the BHS Band will be eligible to participate in the extracurricular component of the Boardman Band. They must attend all scheduled summer band and all performances of the Spartan Marching Band. These students will not be eligible to audition for Spartan Sweethearts, Spartan Silks, Drum Major, Band Vocalist, Section Leader, or any other specialized leadership or auxiliary position. They can play in the percussion section but may not be able to participate in extra Drumline activities.

This participation may necessitate some after-school band rehearsals. Such rehearsals will be mandatory for these students.

Concert Bands - Wind Ensemble and Symphonic Band begin rehearsing and performing at or just before the end of marching band/football season. Placement is determined by audition. Because the groups are smaller than the marching band, they offer students opportunities to explore instrumental music in greater depth and detail than in marching band. There are fewer performances for the concert bands than the marching band. The educational goals of the concert bands deal with individual musical achievement, refined knowledge of one's instrument, greater exploration of the elements of music, knowledge and appreciation of band literature, performance etiquette and stage presence, and basic music theory and history. The concert bands perform two evening concerts per year. Wind Ensemble also participates in District Band Contest and Boardman's Memorial Day Ceremony each May.

Placement in Symphonic Band or Wind Ensemble is determined by audition. Audition requirements and music will be made available in September of each year. Recordings and/or live auditions will be due by a specified date and time in October.

Additional Band Ensembles
Many other smaller groups are formed out of marching and concert band including but not limited to: Basketball Pep Band, BHS Drumline, Christmas Ensemble, Percussion Ensemble, Instrument Demo Groups, Brass Choir, Flute Choir, and many small instrumental ensembles.

## THE BOARDMAN JAZZ ENSEMBLES

The jazz program is for students who desire training and experience in exploring and performing America's musical art form. The jazz ensembles perform at concerts in the school and in the community, and at high school and college jazz festivals. The educational goals of the jazz program include appreciation of jazz history, theory, composers, performers, performance etiquette and stage presence, and various jazz styles. The program also encourages individual creativity via improvisation. Students should schedule an audition with the Band Director prior to requesting Jazz 1 or Jazz 2.

## Jazz Ensemble $1 \quad$ Grades 9, 10, 11, 12; both semesters, 1 credit

Prerequisite: Concurrent band membership; audition
Jazz Ensemble 1 is the top group at Boardman and one of the best high school jazz ensembles in the state. The group has performed at numerous high-profile jazz venues including many well-known jazz clubs in the country. It has hosted and performed with many famous jazz artists and groups. Jazz 1 plays mostly professional and college level music.

Jazz Ensemble $2 \quad$ Grades 9, 10, 11, 12; both semesters, 1 credit
Prerequisite: Concurrent band membership; audition
Jazz Ensemble 2 is the secondary jazz group with similar goals and activities as Jazz 1, but with fewer performances and medium-easy to medium-advanced level jazz literature.
$\underline{2 k x x}$
Grades 9, 10, 11, 12; after school, no credit
Prerequisite: Concurrent band membership; audition
$2 k x x$ is a pop/rock group with electric rhythm section, horns, and vocals. This after-school ensemble is open to Jazz 1 and Jazz 2 students. Band students not enrolled in a jazz class may audition to get into the group. The group rehearses on Mondays and Tuesdays from 3:00 to 4:00 pm. 2kxx performs at jazz concerts and community events/venues.

Summer Jazz Ensembles Grades 9, 10, 11, 12; after school/summer, no credit
Prerequisite: Jazz Ensemble 1 and 2 in the current school year
Summer Jazz Ensembles are basically Jazz Ensemble 1 and 2 but can include recent graduates of the program and incoming members of the bands. Reviving much of the music played during the school year, the groups play three or four times in a summer at local parks, events, and festivals.

The new Financial Literacy requirement is recommended for junior or senior year and MIGHT also be offered in an online format. Summer school could also be a way of taking that and maybe health. Summer/online options will have to be explored in the third scenario (3 musics) because the example does not show a third Social Studies credit.

## ATTENTION: $8^{\text {th }}$ Grade Band Members AND Parents

This is a convenient service that specializes in communication for groups. Every student and at least one parent must join the main group - Boardman HS Band.
