
News from Herb and Markie Burch serving the Lord in Lima, Peru



Return to Lunahuana and Lucumo

Recently DCE intern Levi Karth and I renewed old friendships with people from Lunahuana and Lucumo who were baptized by LCMS missionaries some five to seven years ago. The LCMS entered Peru after the earthquake in ICA. an area 3 hours south of Lima Peru in 2007. Teams from the U.S. worked with Lutheran World Relief to show mercy to our afflicted neighbors and restore damaged infrastructure in the Cañete River Valley. There, DCE interns and workers met the people and made very special friends. Last January short term missionaries from Memorial Lutheran in Sioux Falls SD reconnected with them when they came down to do VBS with us in the North Cone of Lima. There, they found brothers and sisters who had been "abandoned." They asked if we could help. We responded.

As Levi and I walked down a dusty road in Lucumo, we stopped to talk to an elderly woman who was gathering and burning weeds. We asked for Fabiola Sanchez, and she pointed down the road. "Just check the house where the music always plays," she said. As we talked, she asked if we were Lutherans, and then mentioned former DCE Anthony Di Liberto. She put aside her work and accompanied us to her neighbor's house where we knocked. A sweet lady came and greeted us and told us how Anthony used to stay there, and they would share nispera (a sweet yellow fruit) and grapes. Then she went to pick some nispera for us. We shared copies of *Portales de Oracion* (Portals of Prayer) and prayers with these hospitable women before we continued our quest. Acts of kindness imprinted indelible memories on these people's hearts God's recalling workers who shared a cup of water and helped them put their lives together 9 years ago.
