FALL IS A GREAT TIME FOR PLANTING

It's that time of year when the blazing heat of summer gives way to cool nights and warm days. Fall is the perfect season for planting trees, shrubs, cool season annuals, perennials, and spring flowering bulbs. The soil is warm enough for root growth, yet the drying heat of summer has passed. This gives plants a chance to become well established with strong root systems, which will continue to grow even after air temperatures send the plant into dormancy above ground. Come spring, plants with well established root systems can put all of their energy into producing lush leaves and flowers.

Spring flowering bulbs herald the start of the season and display a progression of color through the spring. There are a wealth of bulbs to add to your landscape, including Tulips, Daffodils, Crocus, Iris, Grape Hyacinth, and more. The best time to plant your bulbs is when the temperature is at or below 60 degrees. Let's do some fall planting and add some color to our neighborhood.





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THINK SAFETY WHEN PARKING IN THE STREET

The HOA has received complaints recently about so many vehicles parked in our streets causing a safety hazard for drivers and pedestrians. There have been some close calls with drivers having to stop and back up to avoid head on collisions with other cars due to the narrow lane open between parked cars on both sides of the street. This is especially dangerous on corners where parked cars block the view of drivers making turns. Please consider safety when parking in our streets and park at least 20 feet from corners and allow as much driving clearance from the car parked on the other side of the street as possible. Park in driveways when possible without blocking sidewalks as this forces pedestrians to walk in the street. Please let your teenage drivers know about this situation as they might not be aware of these hazards.



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
