





TIMELINE OF ANTI-COMMUNISM: PART ONE

1938 THE HOUSE UN-AMERICAN ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE (HUAC) FORMED.

1940 SMITH ACT PROHIBITED THE "TEACHING AND ADVOCATING" OF SUBVERSIVE DOCTRINES.

1947 TRUMAN CREATED A "LOYALTY REVIEW BOARD" TO INVESTIGATE GOVERNMENT EMPLOYEES. 1200 FEDERAL WORKERS WERE FIRED.


1947 HUAC INVESTIGATES THE MOVIE INDUSTRY.

TIMELINE OF ANTI-COMMUNISM: PART TWO


- 1950 **Ethel and Julius Rosenberg** were charged with spying and giving atomic secrets to the USSR. They were convicted and executed in 1953.
- 1950 <u>Senator Joseph McCarthy</u> announced he had a list of 205 communists working in the State Department. This was never verified.
- McCarthy's anti-communist hearings, on television, were called "witch hunts" and began worrying members of his own Republican party.
- 1954 McCARTHY was reprimanded by Army lawyer Joseph Welch. McCarthy was censured by the Senate and faded from public view.

MUST THEY DIE?

ON March 6, 1951, in a federal courtroom at Foley Square in New York City, this nation's first atom-bomb spy trial began, when the clerk-of-court solemnly intoned:

"The United States of America versus Julius Rosenberg, Ethel Rosenberg and Morton Sobell."

U.S. Atty. Irving Saypol announced that the government was ready.

Julius and Ethel Rosenberg were defended by Emanuel H. Bloch and his father, Alexander Bloch; Sobell was represented by Edward M. Kuntz and Harold M. Phillips.

Nearly 300 talesmen were questioned before a jury of 12 plus four alternates could be seated. It is singular that in a city more than 30% Jewish in population, not a single talesman of Jewish extraction survived the day and a half of questioning before a jury was seated.

TRIAL BY FRESS: The government announced it would call 118 witnesses. Among them were to be top nuclear physicists Dr. J. Robert Oppenheimer and Dr. Harold C. Urey and Lieut. Gen. Leslie Groves, head of the war-time atomic bomb project.







FOR VICE PRESIDENT: CALIFORNIA SENATOR RICHARD NIXON AN ANTI-COMMUNIST CRUSADER










ELECTION OF 1952: EISENHOWER WON BY A LANDSLIDE






EISENHOWER WAS ELECTED PRESIDENT IN 1952 WITH A PLEDGE TO END THE WAR IN KOREA.



Republicans had opposed Franklin Roosevelt's liberal New Deal policies.



President Eisenhower's Cabinet was made up mostly of businessmen. This was due to his belief that success in business would equate to success in government service. His cabinet was described by reporters as "eight millionaires and a plumber".

"What is good for our country is good for General Motors, and vice versa", Quote by Eisenhower's Secretary of Defense.



President Eisenhower DID NOT repeal the New/Fair Deals. His years in office have been described as a time of moderation.

His one attempt to do away with a New Deal program, the TVA, met with so much opposition that he abandoned the effort.

Ike was impressed by the four lane autobahns he saw in Germany at the end of WW II.






In the Highway Act, he committed to build 41,000 miles of highways.

U.S. interstate highway









THE FIRST U.S. HYDROGEN BOMB WAS EXPLODED IN 1952. THE USSR EXPLODED ONE IN 1953.
















LOCATIONS of NUCLEAR WEAPONS TEST SITES










1950's OVERVIEW

- THE 1950's -THE MAJORITY OF AMERICANS EXPERIENCED PROSPERITY
- •GROSS NATIONAL PRODUCT ROSE 250% BETWEEN 1945 AND 1960.
- THE U.S., WITH JUST 6% OF THE WORLD'S POPULATION, PRODUCED HALF OF THE WORLDS GOODS.
- AMERICAN CORPORATIONS BEGAN FORMING GIGANTIC CONGLOMERATES. FOR EXAMPLE, <u>INTERNATIONAL TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH</u> BOUGHT <u>HOTELS</u>, <u>BAKING</u>, <u>INSURANCE</u> AND <u>AVIS RENT-A-CAR</u>.
- OTHER CORPORATIONS BEGAN INVESTING OVERSEAS WHERE LABOR COSTS WERE LOWER.









TIMELINE OF THE CIVIL RIGHTS MOVEMENT 1948-1960

1948 PRESIDENT TRUMAN ISSUED TWO EXECUTIVE ORDERS.

FAIR EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES IN THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT;

- 1954 & 1955 BROWN V. BOARD OF EDUCATION OF TOPEKA, KANSAS, SUPREME COURT RULED SCHOOLS MUST BE DESEGREGATED "WITH ALL DELIBERATE SPEED"
- **1955 ROSA PARKS REFUSED AND THE MONTGOMERY BUS BOYCOTT**
- 1957 STRUGGLE FOR INTEGRATION IN LITTLE ROCK ARKANSAS. PRESIDENT EISENHOWER SENT FEDERAL TROOPS TO ENSURE INTEGRATION
- 1957 THE CIVIL RIGHTS ACT OF 1957, MADE IT A FEDERAL CRIME TO INTERFERE WITH THE VOTING RIGHTS OF U.S. CITIZENS.

FIVE TRENDS OF THE 1950's - 1960's

- EISENHOWER'S AID TO SOUTH VIETNAMESE WOULD MUSHROOM INTO A FULL SCALE WAR.
- THE BROWN VS BOARD OF EDUCATION RULING WOULD CHANGE AMERICAN RACE RELATIONS FOREVER.
- THE CRITICISM OF MASS CONFORMITY WOULD BLOSSOM INTO THE COUNTER CULTURE OF THE 1960's.
- PRO-BUSINESS APPROACH TO GOVERNMENT WOULD BRING THE LIBERAL REFORMS OF KENNEDY AND LYNDON JOHNSON.
- THE FIRST ATTEMPTS AT SPACE EXPLORATION WOULD RESULT IN PLACING AMERICANS ON THE MOON IN 1969.
