

Being back in the RSA for a short while we're busy strengthening relationships with acquaintances, doing logistics & administration work involving paper & pen and getting various gear in order before we leave for South America. Back in the Amazon Heidi and I are focusing on our known contact tribal groups and pioneering new territory with our associate missionaries in these areas.



<u>NEW ZEALANDER/ AMAZON IMPACT • AUG/SEP 16</u>

ROW ESCAPE On 12 August 2016, two scientists narrowly escaped with their lives when arrows rained down on their cance on a river deep in the Amazon Jungle, very near from where we were. One of them was pinned to

the side of the canoe by a bamboo-tipped arrow measuring 6 ft. in length. The other one shot in his side but both lives were saved. Although unprovoked, the attack was in self-defense, proving the need for God-led encounters with people who have yet to meet with their Creator.

That's why people like Gerrit & Suzi (New Zealanders), who felt called to join us, spent some months in the Amazon with us reaching out to such least-reached tribes.

It's not the jungle that changes you ... it's the journey with JESUS as He strips one of reservations and excuses with every supernatural healing in the tribes and each ordinary meal shared amongst new

friends who need to come and know their Saviour. Every endless canoe-ride an act of surrender as we travel towards Heaven, persuading all whom we encounter to join us. (2 Cor. 5:20)

Our small group culturized in the capital to acquaint with the South American values, which contains a lot of the old Inca Empire & Latin American Indian cultures. Hereafter we left for the Andes Mountains, halfway down to the Amazon. We spent 2 weeks in a mountain city teaching formal Spanish, so that our small group could converse basic Spanish to find their way around.

After this we departed for the first Amazon town, driving through Ando-Jungle territory, in foothills of the



over 6000 m high Andes which we crossed previously by bus. Arriving we bought gear like hammocks, pots, tropical medicine etc. A day later we left on a day's travel to our last outpost by large engine powered canoe, a worthy first river experience. From here we targeted two tribes, the one remote. After consistent prayer, much planning and negotiating, the chief of the remote tribe, gave us the right-of-way which is an unheard of thing, due to government laws, manipulated by international protocol.



ARROW TO MY THRUAT We left with some of the tribe travelling 12 hours, 2-days, up river, hunting and fishing en route as our source of nutrition, stopping over on the river bank at night, sleeping beneath reed and canvas for shelter. The first time I went to this tribe in 2006, the one chief held an arrow up my throat/chin after a misunderstanding, the tribe in suspense, myself in a predicament of life and death. Short story: God delivered me from this peril, only after I was prepared to lose my life for Him instead of saving it. God retarded the whole process waiting for my total surrender to the chief who was premeditating to



kill me as his honor was tainted. When I finally surrendered for death, without defense, God supernaturally removed him with arrow and all, sagging in front of me, retreating in a hunched position.

This time, we shared a lot in the form of drama/ music to the tribe. After we prayed for the sick, many were first healed, then saved, baptized and received Bibles as some could already read and write. Then we returned to our jungle town, and we set off to our last tribe, up a larger river. We shared a mighty service, where 7 years ago, for the first time there, we had a group of 24



students from Potchefstroom University, who aided in a very successful outreach. Many were saved and touched

CANOE TRAVEL at that time, only after half of the student group themselves, made full commitments to JESUS CHRIST as Lord, all of us repenting, humbling ourselves before the Lord, the rest getting baptized, and speaking in tongues.



What a joy after so many years to see the fruit of the first impact in this area, having taken root producing many results as these tribes now are strong communities, devoid of carousing etc., which we previously encountered. Herewith we returned on our route and were fortunate to even fly some of the distance back to the big city. Praise God for such another great expedition with much fruit.



<u>USA - CANADA • 23 500 Km - OCT/DEC 16</u>



Reaching the far corners of North America from Miami, Ontario, Vancouver, Los Angeles and back, we travelled 23 500 km in 2.5 months ardently admonishing Believers at over 40 venues, throughout Canada/ USA, to regain their fervor for the Great Commission of JESUS CHRIST. Heb 10:32 – 36, But remember the former days, when, after being enlightened, you endured a great conflict of sufferings, ... For you have need of endurance, so that when you have done the will of God, you may receive what was promised. We were also privileged to see the replica of Noah's Ark in Kentucky, USA. We also did presentations in many other cities and towns in between campaigning for God's Kingdom.
