#### The Artists.....

**Miles Benson (Heathcliff)** was the White House correspondent for 16 years for the Newhouse newspaper group and Advance Publications. For the last 10 years he has worked as correspondent and editor of Earth Focus, a televised environmental affairs report. This is his fourth role for Cosmos Theatre. He has appeared in *The House of Many Colors*, *Theresa* and *Prometheus*.

**Anthony E. Gallo (Playwright and Director)** is a playwright, screenwriter, librettist, and lyricist is the author of 21 two-act Dramas. He has also written one screenplay *Charleston Revisited* and four musicals.

**Bunty Ketcham (Marion )** appeared in *The Last Days of King Saul, The Springfield Boys, Eugenio* at the Greenbelt Arts Center, and *Paul.* She majored in Sociology at Wellesley College, did graduate work at Catholic University in Systems Analysis and at NTL in Organization Development. She recently played the role of Power in *Prometheus* produced by the Cosmos Club Theatre Group.

**Tarpley Long (Nelly)** a recently retired psychoanalyst. She is a graduate of Studio Theatre Acting Conservatory. Her most recent roles were as Boo in *The Botticelli Cruise* and Peggy Eaton in *The Eaton Woman*, and plays by Anthony Gallo produced at The Greenbelt Arts Center. She is a founding member of the Greenbelt Arts Center and is currently on the Board of Thunderous Productions. Trix is a graduate of Harvard Law School, is retired from the Prince Georges County Public Defender's office, and performs Celtic music with the Homespun Ceilidh Band. She is composing the music for the musical Vandergrift.

**Absurdist Comedy:** Absurd Surreal humor (also known as absurdist humor) is a form of humor predicated on deliberate violations of causal reasoning, producing events and behaviors that are obviously illogical. Constructions of surreal humor tend to involve bizarre juxtapositions on-sequiturs, irrational or absurd situations and expressions of nonsense. The humor arises from a subversion of audience's expectations, so that amusement is founded on unpredictability, separate from a logical analysis of the situation. The humor derived its appeal from the fact that the situation described is so ridiculous or unlikely. The genre has roots in Surrealism in the arts.
