Hi All

I am always amazed at how quickly technology is changing and how that has impacted marine use applications.

Now, with any smart phone, we can get tide, wind, weather, current and complete navigation information. The same is true on iPads. We have our phones and iPads loaded with these various apps for backup to our main laptop driven Coastal Navigation program.

We always take one iPhone with us in the dinghy - both for communication, but also as a reserve should fog move in. The major limitation to these has been access to cell service. Now there is a small GPS hotspot for Apple products that can be bought online for under \$100. We have used it on our other boat in conjunction with an iPad and it's worked great throughout the San Juan's, even Deer Harbor, and coming down through the straits - areas where cell coverage can be difficult.

This still doesn't give you seamless and constant GPS coverage, nor provide communication capabilities. However, there is a new product out that gives you that - it's called Sat-Fi Satellite Hot Soot by Globalstar. It provides constant Wifi thru satellite link that gives you continual voice, text and email capabilities anywhere. It's not cheap - about \$1000. For us and our kids and grandkids, or for any emergency medical issues, it is very important, particularly as we expand our cruising areas.

Another great example is Furuno's DES4W - a new radar closed-array, 4W done, which only needs a power source - it transmits to your laptop or related smart technology devices via wifi using an app (available for S and android based systems. Although I have not looked at costs yet, it is based on the fact that large display screens are expensive and it will take huge increases in number of units produced to make any headway on costs. Imagine the wiring mess this eliminates, particularly with two or more steering stations aboard. We have also changed in the way we use our VHF. We have two built-in units with emergency buttons and all, but find we are using our handheld unit more and more. Last spring, West Marine had a sale on Uniden handhelds for \$38 a piece. We bought two - one for everyday and the dinghy, and one as a spare. None of the above should be used exclusively - I know it's old-fashioned, but I still feel every skipper and mate should know how to navigate via marine charts. I always have a marina atlas with me while running. Who knows what is next, but the added safety and communication capabilities of these new devices can be comforting. It's just hard sometimes to remember that you can always turn everything off and be off the grid!
