

### Fleet Week '00

Staten Island Fleet Week, Inc. will be hosting OPSAIL/INR at the USS The Sullivans Pier in Stapleton, on Staten Island, the week of July 4th.. This will be an exciting week for all Staten Islanders, as we will be hosting nine ships at the Homeport Pier, two at Pier 2 and one at the Lighthouse Museum. The tall ships and naval vessels will come from far away as Asia and are schedule to include: The USS Nassau, the USS Monterey, a frigate from Brazil, the HS Aris from Greece, the JDS Wuugiri from Japan, the tall ship Jeanie Johnston from Ireland, a Pakistani ship, a frigate from the Netherlands and Singapore's RSS Endurans., These ships will be docking alongside our American warships.

On July 6th, the Third Annual Sunset Parade will be held aboard the USS Nassau, on Thursday July 6th at 6:00pm. 

# Burial Honors for Veterans - Guaranteed

As part of the 2000 Defense Authorization Act, Congress has acted to insure that every veteran can receive military honors at his or her funeral, if that is the families wish.

As of January 1, all eligible veterans are now entitled, upon request, to a minimum of two service members who will fold and present an American flag to surviving family members and to a bugler to play, or, if a bugler isn't available, an electronic recording of "Taps".

At least one member of the funeral detail will be from the parent military service of the deceased veteran. The other may be from the same or from another military service. Other authorized providers, such as members of veterans' organizations, may augment the military detail.

By law, all veterans are now eligible for funeral honors if they served in the active military and were discharged under any conditions other than dishonorable or if they were a member or former member of the Selective Reserve. Veterans are ineligible, according to the new law, if they were convicted of a state or federal capital offense and sentenced to life in prison without parole or to the death sentence.

The Defense Departments new policy calls for funeral directors, rather than the veterans' families, to contact the military and request the honors. The government has distributed kits to 24,000 funeral directors containing information and instructions on how the process works. Also included in the kits are compact disks of "Taps". Since there are only 500 buglers in the military at the present time, the department contends that use of a CD is not inappropriate because the bugler playing "Taps" is supposed to be out of sight at funeral services anyway.

The Pentagon has a website to explain the funeral ceremonies: www.militaryfuneralhonors.osd.mil. There is also a toll-free number for funeral directors to coordinate ceremonies - 1-800-MILHONR.



# Cold War Veterans to be Honored in Ceremony

The Honorable Congressman Vito Fossella has announced that he will hold a ceremony honoring all Staten Island Cold War veterans, later this year. The celebration will culminate with each participating veteran receiving the official Cold War Recognition Certificate, which was authorized by Congress in 1998 and pays tribute to our military service.

The Cold War Recognition Certificate will be awarded to all veterans who served faithfully and honorably during the Cold War era, September 2, 1945 through December 26, 1991. National Guard, reservists and active duty military are also eligible.

If you would like to obtain a certificate or attend the ceremony, please call the Congressman's assistant, Ginger, at 718-356-8400. Veterans need to supply either their Social Security Number or Military Service Number. There is no charge for a Cold War Recognition Certificate.



### OH CANADA!

During the turbulent '60's, a Canadian television commentator, Gorden Sinclair, was sick and tired of the America bashing that was taking place all over the world. He recorded his thoughts and set them to music. Do You Remember? If not, here is what he said (without the music, of course):

Our neighbors have faced it alone, and I'm one Canadian who is damned tired of hearing them get kicked around. They will come out of this with their flag high. And when they do, they are entitled to thumb their nose at the lands that are gloating over their present troubles.

I hope Canada is not one of them."


