Pastor's Corner

Well friends, as I write this, I'm just over 24 hours back from Alaska. It was overcast and chilly there almost the entire time, but as soon as I got back to "the lower 48" I immediately felt bad for complaining because I learned how horribly hot and dry it's been. I have quite a few stories to share from Wiebke and my time in Alaska, but I'll focus on this one for now. Early in the trip, during a little shuttle tour of Anchorage, I was fascinated to learn about the 1964 earthquake there. It happened at 5:36 PM on March 27th. I'll tell you the significance of that date and time in just a minute (no Google cheating) ... Across south-central Alaska, ground fissures, collapsing structures, and tsunamis resulting from the earthquake caused about 131 deaths. Given the sheer magnitude of the quake, this was actually a relatively small number. Nine died as a result of the earthquake itself and another 122 died from the subsequent tsunami all over the world.

You have to understand that in Alaska, they have earthquakes every day, but they're very small (not even perceptible) and last only a few seconds. But on 3/27/64, lasting four minutes and thirty-eight seconds, the magnitude 9.2 megathrust earthquake remains

the most powerful earthquake recorded in North American history, and the second most powerful earthquake recorded in world history (effects of it reached through the earth to Australia – I'm not making this up). Six hundred miles (970 km) of fault ruptured at once and moved up to 60 ft (18 m), releasing about 500 years of stress buildup. Soil liquefaction (yes, the ground actually became a liquid state for all intents and purposes and when it stopped the land was in a very different shape), fissures, landslides, and other ground failures caused major structural damage in several communities and much damage to property. Anchorage sustained the greatest destruction. But here's the part I'll never forget. I believe all 9 deaths were in Anchorage, but the tour guide said if it would have happened on another day (or any other Friday for that matter) at that time, thousands more would have died ... Why do you ask? Because the vast majority of those who would have been affected the worst (in the particular residential area hit the hardest) were on their way inland to Good Friday services! The tour guide jokingly said, "And the moral of that story, my friends is 'Don't be late to church' ... but it floored me ... think about that. From a Christian perspective, that's not a coincidence. Think of the staggering providential nature of that ... All of their homes in that area were completely destroyed, but they were in a much safer place when it happened. [Okay, now you can Google it all you want!]

Just as that evening thousands were going to worship in that section of Alaska, to remember God saving his people through the cross, those people were also saved from death. [By the way, remember, there was also an earthquake during the crucifixion on Good Friday, as recorded by the Gospels]. Many lessons can be learned from that day, such as a reminder that the power of nature cannot be fully predicted or controlled. But even more important is that the power of God is greater, and that the Lord is in control of all. Put your hope in God's providential care.


Crafternoon: Did you know that yarn crafting is good for your health? Below are 10 reasons you should give our Crafternoon group a try!



A Devotional For You – Read 2 Chronicles 34:1-4, 33 & 2 Kings 23:3-5, 24-25


About a month ago, one of our members shared a recent article with me about revival. Since then, it's come back to my mind a couple times, particularly when I've been reading about biblical characters like King Josiah. It's a familiar theme in the Old Testament: God's people, Israel, are called to make a difference in the world and honor God by being a light to the Gentiles (everyone beyond them) – sound familiar? ... At first, they're worshiping God, honoring his Word, "keeping the faith," so to speak, but then ... they backslide, turning to idolatry in many different forms as well as the lifestyle and behavior of the cultures around them. They begin to have amnesia about who they are and whose they are. But eventually, at some point in the decline, there arises a remnant of people who see the need and begin to pray. That's how it always starts – with humble, repentant, fervent prayer. In God's own timing, God sends something – often a leader (or several), but sometimes something else, and a time of revival comes. My main point is that we shouldn't associate the word "revival" merely with the old American "Great Awakenings" – that's like only seeing one facet on the diamond of the Holy Spirit's breathtaking work! I'd like to share a short section of the aforementioned article with you – "When God Shows Up in Church" by Dave Butts.

The author writes, "Revival is not strange or mystical. It is simply the Church waking up to the presence of Christ in her midst ... It is God shaking us ... Most churches have all kinds of activities. They've tried all kinds of programs. They've given and done everything the know how to do to get the Church going and to impact society. But in all that has happened in the last fifty years in the US, are we a more moral and ethical nation because of what we've been doing? It's unbelievable when we consider the tremendous acts of sacrifice, service and ministry in the last fifty years in the Church ... We are at a 'wonderful point of hopelessness' in which the Church is beginning to recognize that we have been doing everything we know how to do and it is not working. Which means, it's time for revival. It's time to humble ourselves before God and ask Him to make Himself known to us in the midst of His people." [If you'd like me to share the entire article with you, please just let me know!]

My aim is that you want to do far more than learn about revivals (in Scripture and in world history). Will you begin praying fervently? Will you lead your family to do the same? Before we can call others to repentance, we have to do it ourselves in great measure. It reminds me of the morning after we got back from Alaska, I got in the shower (not knowing the water heater was out), and the shower was COLD! Not just lukewarm, not tepid, but bracingly, shockingly, cold. It was unpleasant, but got my attention. It stirred me. We need the same from God. Only then, can we bring our intercession and our concern to bear on neighbors and others. We can't do this alone. Are you prepared to reach out to fellow Christians of other churches with whom you rarely interact? Basically, as fast as you learn anything about the subject of revival (start by unlearning the stereotypes), then put it into practice. So ... when it comes to Puckety's mission statement: "We, personally and collectively, honor God, grow in faith, and improve our community and world." Is it simply a statement to you, a 'principle' you have learned? Or is it something you are girding with prayer and dressing with action? Imagine yourself among the masses that young Josiah addressed, whom he called to humility and holiness. Are you stirred? Josiah pledged to obey the Lord by keeping all the commands of the Lord "with all his heart and soul," and he moved the people to do the same, making a similar pledge, renewing their covenant with God. Let's unite in a similar common pledge: that we will turn to the Lord with all our heart and soul, obey his Word, and pray for God's Spirit to fall upon this Church and upon all our community. Amen.


"New Member" Small Group
