
Lynne Andrews will be here for a seminar on September 7 & 8. Cost for the two day seminar is \$80.00 and \$10.00 per day for food.

<u>President – Nancy Genetti</u> Nancy mentioned that the October meeting has been changed from October 21 to October 14 due to the conflict of many members who would be attending the OKC Palooza Convention. The change of date has been changed with the Botanic Garden.

<u>Secretary – Peggy Thomas</u> The minutes of the previous meeting (November 19, 2018) were approved as written.

<u>Programs – Connie Alexander</u> Tonight Peggy Thomas is teaching the Believe Santa on a clipboard. Next month is the glass brick Santa Snowman which will be taught by Dusti Dancer. March will be Beth Stodieck teaching an ornament with bells and holly. April Nancy Genetti will teach the Shara Reiner plate and in May Sharlene King will do a frog project. September we will have a Make-and-Take surprise. In October Dusti Dancer will teach a Barb Jones pumpkin project, and in November Peggy Thomas will do a Renee Mullins ornament project. Beth Stodieck added that for her project she used Bobbie's Blender Set, brushes that are excellent for shading.

<u>Treasurer Report – Louise Smith</u> The checking account has a balance of \$4,330.56 and a savings account balance of \$3,711.79 for a total of \$8,042.35. The Treasurer's report for 2018 was filed for audit.

<u>Hospitality – Armida Guzman</u> She is going to pass around the notebook for food sign-ups for February through November meetings. She asked that everyone jot down what they sign up for in their calendars even though it will be printed in the Newsletters before the meeting.

February Project—Faux Santa by Barb Jones

I passed out pattern packets at the January meeting in case the full size pattern did not come out in the newsletter. This is the type of project to practice substituting paint colors on. If you do not have a color listed use something close the piece is small and you use a very small amount of paint so don't buy paint you may not need again.

Base coating instructions are in steps 1-7. The Dried Basil or Reindeer Moss Green that is used with the Buttermilk in the first steps is very light, just enough to give a slightly different look to the Buttermilk. That is why I say don't buy paint you might not need later. Just use what you have.

The project can be painted on the surface of your choice. The original pattern was designed for a glass block. These blocks can be purchased at home improvement stores or Hobby Lobby has a craft version available. Stands are available from Barb Jones and the information is in the packet. You will need a very fine liner brush to outline with when we finish.

Barb's pieces are a lot of fun to paint and look at. I hope you enjoy this one!

Palette:Dried Basil Green, Lamp Black, Buttermilk, Tomato Red, Tangelo, Driftwood,

Antique Green, Deep Burgundy, Espresso, Primary Yellow, Titanium White. I used Reindeer Moss in place of Dried Basil, Soft Sage would work or Celery with a little Buttermilk added. Don't be afraid to substitute.

Bobbie Campbell Christmas Bells Pattern alterations by Beth Stodieck, 2019 FWDP Chapter meeting 3/2019

Bobbie's project was a much larger piece than we will be doing at the meeting. I've used Bobbie's pattern to come up with a couple of patterns that could be adapted for different shaped ornaments. And I will be happy to let you draw off Bobbie's original design in class if you would like to do the whole thing later but we will not print it anywhere because it is Bobbie's pattern. You can take better pictures of my project at the meeting.

The ornament and size are up to you. Think Della tin ornaments, any wood shape, wrapped around a birdhouse ornament, puffed hearts, Christmas trees and so forth. The original was on a large metal tag from Della. My revision of the pattern to fit our needs will be in the March newsletter but any large ornament size surface will work. We will only be doing a small portion of the original pattern due to time limits of our meeting.

Bobbie uses <u>Royal Aqualon flat brushes</u>, #'s 2,6,10, ³/₄, and #1<u>liner</u>. In my opinion, you can use the brushes you are most comfortable with in the same sizes or in angle brushes. **However**, the magic happens with her <u>Bobbie Campbell Blenders</u> in sizes Small, Medium and Large. They are her special blend of synthetic and natural fibers and they truly are magic. I will have a couple I can loan out (I'll take a blood oath that you'll return them!) but if you like the soft, blended look of Bobbie's pieces, these are the brushes that make them happen. I've used them a lot since Palooza. You can order them at www.royalbrushstore.com . Search for Bobbie. They have them individually or in a set of 4. If you choose not to buy them, bring the best quality mop/stipple brushes that you have in different sizes.

Basecoat for the background is a mix of $\frac{1}{2}$ Avocado and $\frac{1}{2}$ Black Green. If you make this or any mix to use for basecoating, save some of that mix because you WILL want to touch up the background after painting.

Soup from the January Meeting—Yum!

Grilled Chicken/Veggie Kabob Stoup By Beth Stodieck, 2018

- This recipe was originally designed when I cooked WAY too many chicken and veggie kabobs while camping this summer. I had to figure out what to do with the leftovers so I could freeze them since the camper fridge is teeny tiny! Everything had been preseasoned and grilled as kabobs and I just added new goodies to make the stew.
- This recipe is easily enlargeable to feed a crowd and freezes well. I don't add the potatoes if I plan on freezing before serving. Add the potatoes as you warm the stew to serve. In this case chunky frozen hash browns work great!
- Measurements aren't given because I seasoned the kabobs generously before grilling. Season to your taste.
- Avocado oil remains stable at high temps so I use it for almost all of my cooking now, especially on the grill.

Adjust veggie amounts to your taste to make it even healthier.

- The Montreal Steak Seasoning and Fajita Seasoning are the only salt and pepper you will use so be generous.
- If you use wooden skewers instead of metal, soak them in clean water for 15-30 minutes to prevent burning on the grill.
- This was originally made over a real campfire. The fire you can reproduce. The mountain air, not so much! Sorry.

2-4 zucchini, quartered lengthwise into sticks
1-2 medium onions, quartered lengthwise
1# whole mushrooms, washed and dried
2 ears fresh corn, husks removed
2-3 large chicken breasts, ³/₄ - 1" cubes
Montreal Steak Seasoning (MSS), to taste
Fajita Seasoning (FS), to taste
Avocado oil or other flavorless oil of your choice

1 can diced tomatoes, with juice

1 small can tomato sauce

1/4 - 1 full can Rotel tomatoes, original style

- 1 2 cans corn, drained (if fresh corn is not available)
- 2 russet potatoes, peeled, 1/2" dice
- Cumin, ground, to taste
- 1 tsp dried cilantro, more or less to taste, optional
- 1-2 tsp Knorr chicken base or 1-2 cubes chicken bullion
- 2 cups chicken stock

1-2 cups water, adjusted to make it more like soup or stew as desired

OPTIONAL: corn chips, cornbread, Monterey Jack cheese shreds, sour cream, green onion garnish

Starting with zucchini, wash, cut as directed and place in a large bowl.

- Drizzle zucchini with avocado oil, sprinkle with FS and/or MSS and toss to coat well. Place on large cookie sheet and move to next veggie.
- Repeat with whole mushrooms and whole corn.
- Gently spread layers of onion quarters and then place on metal skewers directly thru the center of each quarter.
 - Spread the layers again after on the skewer and drizzle or brush with oil and season to taste with MSS/FS. Turn it over and do second side of each skewer. Set aside.
- Place all chicken pieces in the bowl and repeat steps for prepping veggies. Skewer seasoned meat onto skewers, leaving a bit of room between each piece to allow heat and smoke to surround each piece.
- Make a large charcoal or wood fire on your favorite grill. The wood gives extra flavor to the finished dish. You want to cook this hot and fast. The mission is not to completely cook the food over the fire, just to add flavor. Char adds that flavor.
- One veggie at a time, place veggies on your fire and cook until a nice char is all over. Turn often and remove when nicely browned. If your fire isn't hot enough you will overcook the food before you get the color and flavor of the fire. Full cooking will follow when stew is simmered with liquid ingredients.
- Repeat with the chicken skewers.
- When veggies and chicken are cool, dice in ½" pieces, cut corn off of cobs and place in a stockpot appropriate for the size of your batch.
- Add canned tomatoes, Rotel, tomato sauce, canned corn if using, potatoes, stock base/bullion, chicken stock and water. Add cilantro if using.
- Simmer gently, not allowing it to come to a boil, at least until potatoes are tender but an hour or more is better. After simmering, adjust seasoning with MSS, FS and cilantro as desired. It's definitely better the second day!
- Serve with optional garnishes.


