

Little Marais Restoration Finds Renewed Life with New Owner

Back when he was a teen Marcus LeBarge found a special niche in his world that, at the time, he had no idea would turn into owning his own business.

Once a high school student lucky enough to be welcome to use the facilities at Little Marais Restoration to paint his first car, LeBarge kept hanging around the auto body shop until he was officially hired on by then-owner Ed Brown.

"I did my high school car here, a '71 Nova while Ed pointed his finger and told me how to go about using his facility to do priming and painting," said LeBarge.

Brown was prone to mentoring on young apprentices who were interested in cars, and LeBarge says their informal relationship as Brown's "protege" eventually turned into twelve years of working for and learning from the man. After that time, LeBarge moved on for a couple of years to help his family's business.

Then an unexpected turn of events left LeBarge feeling like he had unfinished business. Brown passed away unexpectedly at the age of 54 last April, and LeBarge felt the loss especially keenly as his home is across the road from Little Marais Restoration.

"Every day I would drive by and think about him, I didn't want to see all his hard work go to waste," said LeBarge. Finally, LeBarge bought the shop last November.

Brown started his career in vehicle painting

as a kid painting bicycles in his neighborhood, and at the age of 18 opened a body shop in Gilmore, Illinois before finding his way to the north shore.

Brown moved to the north shore in 1995, completing his first paint job in the new location in a little garage with a wood stove. That car was a '69 Camaro that has been seen all around the area for years, and now is owned by one of LeBarge's uncles. "And it still looks great!," said LeBarge.

LeBarge's own family history is rooted in the car world, with his grandfather, Eddie Dugas, starting the first auto body store on the north shore in the mid-1950's. The next generation, LeBarge's "Dugas Uncles" worked at the family garage for a time, and uncle Paul eventually won awards for car painting.

Now LeBarge is determined to carry on Brown's work of restoring cars in the area.

"I was his right-hand man, he taught me every aspect of the business, from taking cars apart, to repair, and how to deal with customers. I'd like to see his legacy live on," said LeBarge.

Little Marais Restoration, (218)226-6435, is located eight miles north of Silver Bay on Highway 61 and is a full auto-collision repair facility. LeBarge says that frame straightening, dent repair, alignment and spray painting are all available, along with old car restoration work.
