

Crowning of The Blessed Virgin Mary

A May Crowning is a traditional devotion in which an image of the Blessed Virgin Mary is crowned, usually with a wreath of flowers. It may be done within the context of a Mass or in a paraliturgy outside the Mass in which there might be Scripture readings, a homily, singing of hymns, devotional prayers such as the rosary, a procession, etc. This act of filial devotion is done in the springtime, during the month of May to recognize Mary as Queen of Heaven, Queen of Earth and Queen of Peace.

As you may or may not know, about 4-5 years ago, Carrie Davis generously donated the statue of the Virgin Mary that stands before you adjacent to the altar. Today we have the pleasure of Carrie's granddaughter, Wyatt Rae McCorkle crowning our Holy Mother on this special day, "Mother's Day". We thank Carrie for all she has done for our church and thank Wyatt for being with us on this glorious day.
