




It is **NEVER** okay to disconnect smoke detectors from the wall. The hardware must be plugged in at all times even when changing the battery.

## **Stovetop Cheeseburger Pasta**

#### **Ingredients**

- 1 package (16 ounces) penne pasta
- 1 pound ground beef
- 1/4 cup butter, cubed
- 1/2 cup all-purpose flour
- 2 cups 2% milk
- 1-1/4 cups beef broth
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 3 teaspoons ground mustard
- 2 cans (14-1/2 ounces each) diced tomatoes, drained
- 4 green onions, chopped
- 3 cups shredded Colby-Monterey Jack cheese, divided

#### **Directions:**

- Cook pasta according to package directions; drain.
- Meanwhile, in a Dutch oven, cook and crumble beef over medium heat until no longer pink, 5-7 minutes.
- Remove from pan with a slotted spoon; pour off drip-
- In same pan, melt butter over low heat; stir in flour until smooth. Cook and stir until lightly browned, 2-3 minutes (do not burn).
- Gradually whisk in milk, broth, Worcestershire sauce and mustard.
- Bring to a boil, stirring constantly; cook and stir until thickened. 1-2 minutes.
- Stir in tomatoes; return to a boil.
- Reduce heat; simmer, covered, 5 minutes.
- Stir in green onions, pasta and beef; heat through.
- Stir in half of the cheeses until melted.
- Sprinkle with remaining cheese; remove from heat.
- Let stand, covered, until melted.
