


# **2025 DUES ARE NOW DUE!**

#### CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

When you give thanks, you express the certainty of being loved. This is a big step; to have the certainty of being loved. Pope Francis.

Think about a gift, a favor, a kind word you have received lately. Let yourself feel grateful. For that brief moment of giving thanks, love is certain. When you doubt love, offer thanks.

Red is ubiquitous (I love that word!) during February. Red hearts abound. As you know, the day honors a third century Roman Saint. Not much is known about St. Valentine, but we do know that he was martyred for secretly marrying Christan couples. I wonder if this part of his story is why the Saint's Day morphed into a Hallmark Holiday.

I am not anti-Valentines' Day, even though Jesus hasn't sent me flowers in years! During these dreary dark winter months, we need reminders that love is certain. We often feel alone at this time of year and not just because of the holiday. We are creatures of the earth, and our bodies respond to these cold dark months. We are tempted to stay in our cave and hibernate. What's the remedy? Well, a trip to Jamaca would cheer us up for a bit or even a day at the shore, a few strong cocktails or a couple of Tastykake's would help. Fill in your blank. Temporary relief helps but does it sustain us?

Gratitude does sustain! But how? In my Spiritual Direction Program, we commit to a practice that has made a huge difference in my life. It's called *Examen*. It is rooted in Ignatian Spirituality, and it has sustained me through dark months and very dark periods of my life. Examen is basically a way to review the day and see how God was with you. The first two steps speak to the link between gratitude and love.

Step 1: LIGHT- Ask God to be present with you as you look back at the day. Imagine God and you sitting on a bench looking back at the day together. Ask God for light to help you see what God sees. Talk to God about your day.

Step 2: THANKS- With God, look at what you are grateful for in your day. For example, I got to work safely, or a stranger held the door for me. But here is the key...don't just list that for which you are grateful, think about and talk to God about WHY you are grateful. Not reflecting on why is like never taking the wrapping off of a gift. When you do, explore what you felt at that moment and why you are grateful, you see and even feel the love. WOW!



A real-life example: I received a text from a friend. When I reflected on why I was grateful, it occurred to me that I felt included, loved. Even remembering the text made me feel the certainty of love.

In God's light we see love. By the way, the word Eucharist means thanksgiving.

## STATE OF THE HEART

Please be aware this is my first Medical Minute column for the newsletter. My goal is to keep people informed of terms they may hear and not know the true meaning of. This information is NOT intended to replace any medical advice you receive from your healthcare provider.

My first topic is "Sepsis"

I personally had sepsis not long ago. It is far worse than the flu and if not treated it could be fatal. Your heart rate goes up, blood pressure goes down and you pretty much feel like you cannot function. It usually requires ICU admission.

# **SEPSIS**

A life-threatening complication to an infection.

Sepsis occurs when the body puts out life threatening chemicals in reaction to the infection. This can cause multiple organ failure or may even cause death (in my case, my kidneys started to fail)

# Symptoms:

- Fever
- Increased Heart Rate
- Shortness of breath
- Decreased blood pressure
- Sometimes, mental confusion


## Treatment:

- IV fluids
- Antibiotics

If treated successfully, people may return to a full life.

There are times where not treated successfully patients are required to be on a ventilator and drugs to maintain their blood pressure.
