Our Sabbatical Season

It's almost humorous to go back and read what I wrote in the January newsletter about my sabbatical plans. I was definitely dreaming big and stretching myself out of my comfort zone with our plans to go to Italy and the United Kingdom. For many reasons, we decided to stay closer to home during this sabbatical season, and now, as we continue to navigate our grief and loss, that decision to stay close to home feels even better. As I wrote in January, a clergyperson's sabbatical leave is meant to be a time of Spiritual renewal and rest. As I prepare to begin this sabbatical, I will add another element to the time away that Bob and I will have this summer: recovery. While we will never fully 'recover' from losing Charley, we will take time this summer to focus on our ongoing healing and processing our grief as a family. Additionally, I will be working with a Spiritual Director and therapist as I strengthen and recover and renew my spiritual strength. I promise you all I will be ready to fully return to the pulpit and all of my pastoral duties when I return to the office of August 26. I am so grateful for the time and space and grace you have given me - both immediately following Charley's death and with this sabbatical leave. In many ways, you have saved my life. How can I ever thank you all?

When we decided back in early February that we were not going overseas, I needed to come up with new sabbatical plans. I did not want to waste this precious gift of time away. That was when I saw my 2024 Star Word on my desk: *Blossom*. This felt like a call to be outside and experience the beauty of creation and the renewal nature provides for me. So the bulk of my sabbatical will be spent working in our backyard, creating my long yearned for vegetable garden, spending time outdoors as a family, praying, reflecting, journaling, reading, exercising and perfecting my pasta dough, pizza crust, and pie crust. I will also spend quite a bit of time preparing worship series plans for the fall and Advent/Christmas. I am still planning to begin this time with my attendance at the Festival of Homiletics, but I will attend virtually instead of in person. Bob and I have some very simple plans this summer, our goal is just to hold space each day with love and gratitude. (CONTINUED ON PAGE 2)

I am grateful for your prayers and support during this precious time away. You are giving an amazing gift to your pastor and her family with this sabbatical – but please remember, this time of sabbatical is also meant to be a time of growth and renewal for you, the congregation, as well. What will you discover about your call as a congregation – individually and as a community of faith – during this sabbatical? How is God speaking to you and how do you feel called to serve in new and different ways going forward? I invite you to spend time reflecting on ideas you have for mission and programs for the new program year. I would love to hear ideas you have about what you'd like to hear and study in Bible studies, book studies, and in worship – any sermon topics especially! You know I love worship series themes – is there something you'd like to experience in worship, a topic you'd like to explore through Word, prayer, praise, music, and preaching? Where is God's Spirit calling us to engage with our local and global community in deeper and meaningful ways?

I will return to the office on Monday, August 26th but please be assured that all of you, and this extraordinarily beautiful and special community of faith of Hope UCC, will be in my

thoughts and daily prayers throughout this sabbatical season. With prayers for renewal, refreshment, and recovery, and deep and abiding love for you all, Pastor Santina
