

Instructions for Circulation of Nomination Papers

Signatures of Electors: Only qualified electors of the State of Wisconsin (at least 18 years old by election date, U.S. citizens who are residents of the 21st Senate District) may sign nomination papers. Each elector signing a nomination paper must list all of the information required. Each elector's municipality of residence must be listed on the nomination paper along with the address, including any street name and number, rural route, number, and/or fire number. Post office boxes are not valid. The circulator may add any missing or illegible information before the papers are filed with the filing officer.

Signature of Circulator: The circulator should carefully read the language of the Certification of Circulator. The circulator must personally present the nomination paper to each signer. The nomination paper may <u>not</u> be left unattended on counters or posted on bulletin boards. The circulator's complete address, including municipality of residence, must be listed in the certification. After obtaining signatures of electors, the circulator must sign and date the certification. A notary is <u>not</u> required.



The 21st Senate District includes the following:

Kenosha County: Includes the towns of: Brighton, Paris, Randall, Salem, and Somers (wards 1-4 & 11); the villages of: Bristol, Paddock Lake, Pleasant Prairie, Silver Lake, and Twin Lakes; the City of Kenosha (ward 88).

Racine County: Includes the towns of: Dover, Yorkville, Norway, Raymond, and Burlington (wards 1-7 & 11); the villages of: Caledonia, Mt. Pleasant (wards 1-17, & 20), North Bay, Rochester, Sturtevant, Union Grove, and Wind Point; the City of Racine (wards 13, 16, 20, 27, 28, 34, 35, 36).

Nomination papers may not be circulated before April 15, 2014.
