

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

TOWN OF KREMMLING REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING April 3, 2019

The Board of Trustees, for the Town of Kremmling, met in the boardroom located at 200 Eagle Avenue. Mayor Grover Pryor called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Trustees present: Holly Martinson, Gina Schroeder, Jason Wikberg, Leo Pesch, Dave Sammons, and Erik Woog. Staff present: Town Manager Dan Stoltman, Public Works Director Jason Bock and Interim Town Clerk Joanna Eaton.

SAMMONS MOVED TO APPROVE THE REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING MINUTES OF MARCH 20, 2019. SCHROEDER SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

WOOG MOVED TO APPROVE THE EXPENDITURES FROM MARCH 20, 2019 THROUGH APRIL 3, 2019 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$99,653.95. MARTINSON SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

THE APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA WAS NOT STATED.

Police Chief Report:

Lieutenant Todd Willson was in attendance and spoke for Police Chief Lucas. He said everything in the police department is going well. However, while cleaning out the evidence room they came across Potassium Cyanide and are having a difficult time getting rid of it. Estimates from Environmental Control Groups are anywhere from \$1,250 to \$3,000 to have it removed. It is too dangerous to keep in the evidence room, they are looking to get rid of it as soon as possible. They shouldn't see any issues with the budget in doing so.

The Public Works Director reported:

- Jason said they ran into a bit of a hiccup last Friday at the water plant. One of the flocculators went out, the same one that broke just two years ago. Jason brought a worker from Velocity up to the plant to take a look at it. Velocity mentioned how they may look into an upgraded one or a newly designed flocculator. Right now, they are running without it, which isn't a major problem until the high flow run off and high demand comes. He's hoping it gets fixed by the end of this month.
- Engineers are working on a pre-bid packet for a water line across the airport. They are hoping to go up for bid in the next couple weeks in order to get it started soon.
- A drain pan across Jackson will need to be put in. Most of the water in town backs up there and can become a big issue. Jason is hoping to have parts of central paved as well, as it has gotten bad over the years.

Town Manager Dan Stoltman spoke on behalf of his third day as manager. He has started going through the applications for the Town Clerk Position and will set times for interviews. Within the three days here Manager Stoltman has been getting to know the staff, community, procedures/policies, and the code book. He feels like this will be a good fit and wants everyone to know that they can come to him with any questions.

Jeannette Luttrell spoke as a citizen. She wanted to introduce herself and welcome the new manager. There were no other citizen comments.

Mayor Pryor swore in new Municipal Court Judge Ron Carlson. Ron wanted to thank Kremmling for the opportunity to serve.

Aaron Macarelli from Visionary Broadband spoke to the board on bringing a high-speed broadband internet service to the town. This is a wireless service therefore they would need to lease space and power on the town's water tank. They may need to add smaller secondary towers throughout the town so every spot is hit. The antenna that would be placed on to the tank is very small and would be hard to recognize. If everything goes right, they plan on offering 10, 50, and 100 megabits internet packages at a reasonable price. The service should be solid during the stormy winter months, with occasional cut outs. Aaron would like to provide a lease proposal to see if this is something the town would like to pursue. Jason did not see any problems with leasing out the tank, however he would have to provide

them with a key for emergency access incase the internet went out. The board was interested in seeing a proposal from Visionary Broadband.

WOOG MOTIONED TO ALLOW VISIONARY BROADBAND TO MOVE FORWARD WITH ITS ENGINEERING STUDIES TO ENTERTAIN A POTENTIAL LEASE TO BRING BROADBAND SERIVICES TO THE TOWN. SAMMONS SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

Mayor Pryor removed the department liaisons now that the town has a manager.

As the board talked about future agenda items, the mosquito control contract was brought up. Trustee Sammons mentioned how they are going to try to do the work up front. The first spray will be done for Kremmling Days and another spray for the Fourth of July, these are within the budget. Donations will be accepted for the mosquito control this summer. Trustee Martinson mentioned how she would like to see a cop car parked somewhere on highway 40 or highway 9 to control speeding throughout the town. This is something that Chief Lucas would have to look into. The board members also mentioned how they would like to possibly consider changing highway 40 in town back to four lanes, instead of two lanes with a bike zone. The board decided this is a topic they did not want to get too involved with at this time and may be added to a future agenda. Trustee Martinson would also like to see the trash company Ace's High develop a better system for recycling, such as creating a punch pass or a set rate instead have having to pay every time you go for recycling. Sammons wanted to look into how long the town has to maintain the free charging station for vehicles.
