You Are My Father: Prayer of Abandonment

On the day my parents brought me home from the hospital, my Dad took a picture of me on their doorstep as if I had been left there for them to find. This image, though, always serves to remind me of the vulnerable and holy posture of total abandonment to God. Of laying ourselves down with the complete resignation that nothing is sufficient to enable us to do God's will unless He himself helps us to do it.

When we abandon ourselves to Him, even when our abandonment is profound, it will never be enough. However, with His grace, even the tiniest speck of faith and commitment can move a mountain. There are two things at play here. One is our radical surrender and self-emptying, our stripping ourselves of any pretense that we have or are anything good apart from God.

The other is the belief that God *will* come through for us and give us graces to cooperate with Him in extraordinary ways. He will call us to be magnanimous and great-hearted and plunge into the work of redeeming the world for Christ. We may teeter uncertainly on the cliff, yet He will hold His hands out to us, ready to catch us. When it is His will, if we act in faith in Him and not in ourselves, we have nothing to fear. It is *trust to the tenth degree*.

What is His will? That's a good question.

One key to discernment is detachment from even our preferences which allows us to move out of the way enough to *see things the way God sees them*. And when we can see more clearly what is for His glory, and what will bring about our holiness, we'll be able to discern our next right thing. We abandon our own desires, wishes, dreams—we lay them down like a baby on His doorstep. And He will bend down to lift them up into something more wonderful than we could have imagined. A surrendered soul is irresistible to Him.

None of us would be able to leave a helpless child placed at our feet. Neither can the Lord leave us when we are weak. It is our

very weakness that draws Him to us, that calls to His heart, that urges Him to move into the abyss of our lives and drench us with salvation. *A surrendered soul is irresistible to God.*

Our Dad is building a Kingdom and He is more than capable of doing it alone with just a breath or a word—but He loves us enough to give us a hammer or a flashlight to hold. And all the while, we are being held, too.

That is the love of a Father—that is God's love for us.

Tu Eres mi Padre: Oración de Abandono

El día en que me trajeron mis padres del hospital a la casa, mi Papa me tomo una foto en las gradas de la casa como si me hubieran dejado ahí y ellos me encontraron. (Mi mama quiere que ustedes sepan que ellos no me encontraron en las gradas).

Esta imagen, pues, siempre me sirve para recordar la postura vulnerable y santa de un total abandono hacia Dios. De entregarnos con una completa resignación de que nada es suficiente para que nos haga hacer la voluntad de Dios a menos que el mismo nos ayude a hacerla. Cuando nos abandonamos a El, aun cuando nuestro abandono sea profundo, nunca será lo suficiente. Sin embargo, con su gracia, aun los pequeños trocitos de fe y compromisos pueden mover una montaña.

Hay dos cosas en juego aquí. Una es nuestro radical abandono y el vaciarnos a nosotros mismos, el desnudarnos nosotros mismos de cualquier pretensión que tengamos de que no somos nada Bueno apartados de Dios.

La otra cosa es la creencia de que Dios nos dará las gracias para cooperar con El de maneras extraordinarias. El nos llamara a ser magnánimos y con un gran corazón y nos sumergiremos en la obra de la redención del mundo por Cristo. Podremos tener incertidumbres vacilantes en el abismo, sin embargo, El extenderá su mano hacia nosotros, listo para recibirnos. Cuando es su voluntad, si actuamos con fe en El y no en nosotros mismos, no tenemos nada que temer. Eso es confiar hasta el décimo grado. ¿Cuál es su voluntad? Esa es una buena pregunta.

Una clave para discernir es deshacernos de nuestras preferencias las cuales nos sacan del camino de una manera suficiente para ver las cosas de la manera que Dios las ve. Y cuando nosotros podemos ver claramente lo que es para su Gloria, y lo que nos va a traer a nuestra santidad, seremos capaces de discernir la próxima cosa que es buena. Abandonamos nuestros propios deseos, nuestros anhelos, los sueños los colocamos como un bebe en sus gradas. Y Él se agachará para levantarnos para algo más maravilloso de lo que pudiéramos nosotros imaginar. Un alma que se abandona es irresistible para El.

Ninguno de nosotros podríamos ser capaces de dejar a un niño indefenso colocado bajo nuestros pies. Tampoco el Señor nos deja cuando estamos indefensos. Es nuestra propia debilidad que lo acerca a nosotros, la que llama a su Corazón, la que hace que tenga una urgencia para acercarse en el abismo de nuestras vidas y nos llena de salvación. Un alma que se abandona es irresistible para Dios.

Nuestro Padre está construyendo un Reino y Él es más que capaz de hacerlo solo con un suspiro o con una palabra—pero Él nos ama demasiado por eso nos da un martillo o una lampara de mano para que los tengamos con nosotros. Y mientras tanto, Él nos está sosteniendo También.

Ese es el amor de un Padre—así es como Dios nos ama.

The second attitude we should take is one of childlike surprise and wonder. The child, he said, "always asks a thousand questions because he wants to discover the world; in our relationship with the Lord in prayer wonder, he said, telling pilgrims to "open the heart to wonder." When it comes to prayer, he noted that often we are busy with many different activities or projects and say we don't have time. "We lose sight of what is fundamental: our life of the heart, our spiritual life, our life of prayer with the Lord." However, Jesus surprises us in truth by loving us and calling us even in our weaknesses, he said, adding that just as Christ called his disciples, he also calls us to him at each Mass. "This is therefore the greatest grace: to be able to experience the Mass, the Eucharist. It is the privileged moment to be with Jesus, and through Him with God and his bothers."
