OUR SPEAKER

MICHAEL WASHINGTON

Michael Washington is a humble servant for the Lord. His favorite scripture is Phillipians 4:13, "I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me." He resides in the city of Auburn Hills, Michigan with his wife, Lucille, who is an educator. They have two daughters, Fayette and Talicia. He is a member of the Friendship Missionary Baptist Church in the city of Pontiac, under the leadership of Rev. Jerry Love, Pastor. He serves on the Deacon Ministry, Chairman of the Trustee Ministry, Senior Usher Ministry, Male Chorus, Bus Ministry and the Laymen Ministry.

He has spent twelve years as the President of the Crystal Lake District Association Usher's Ministry. He has been an instructor for the Crystal Lake District Congress of Christian Education and an instructor for the Wolverine Baptist Convention Congress of Christian Education. He is currently an instructor for the National Congress of Christian Education. He served from 2001 to 2010 as President of the Wolverine State Baptist Convention Laymen's Movement and also is very active in the National Baptist Convention USA, Inc. Laymen's Movement. In September of 2006 he became the Fifth Vice President of the National Baptist Convention USA Laymen's Auxiliary in charge of the Evangelism and Outreach programs. These programs consist of coordinating the Street Evangelism and Prison Ministry services during the Congress and Annual Session. The National Baptist Laymen have donated items to some local shelters during the National Congress Sessions in June and the Annual Session in September for the last three years. In September of 2014, he was appointed the Vice President at Large of the National Baptist Convention USA Laymen's Auxiliary.

He is currently the Financial Secretary for the Wolverine State Laymen's Department, President of the Crystal Lake District Association Laymen's Department and Treasurer for the Crystal Lake Baptist District Association. He is also the owner of his own janitorial service, and the Coordinator for the National Baptist Laymen's Fellowship Cruise.



Pastor's Pen

A Lesson in Manhood from Pastor Moses

Exodus 33:7-8 records some lessons for men that ring true even today.

7 Moses took his tent and pitched it outside the camp, far from the camp, and called it the tabernacle of meeting. And it came to pass that everyone who sought the Lord went out to the tabernacle of meeting which was outside the camp. 8 So it was, whenever Moses went out to the tabernacle, that all the people rose, and each man stood at his tent door and watched Moses until he had gone into the tabernacle. 9 And it came to pass, when Moses entered the tabernacle, that the pillar of cloud descended and stood at the door of the tabernacle, and the Lord talked with Moses. 10 All the people saw the pillar of cloud standing at the tabernacle door, and all the people rose and worshiped, each man in his tent door. 11 So the Lord spoke to Moses face to face, as a man speaks to his friend. And he would return to the camp, but his servant Joshua the son of Nun, a young man, did not depart from the tabernacle.

Moses would go out to his tent (which became the meeting place for the congregation) to meet with the Lord. Every man in the camp would watch Moses enter the Tent of Meeting. When Moses went in to worship the Lord and hear instruction from Him for the people of Israel, each man would worship at his own tent door. Moses would return to the camp and share with the people what the Lord shared with him, but Joshua stayed at the tent of meeting.

This raises several important points for men. Brother, you should be the worship leader in your household. Throughout the Bible from Old Testament to New Testament the Lord charges men with the responsibility for being the spiritual leader of your house. It is our responsibility as men to nurture our wives and children in the faith. We must study the Bible so we are able to teach it to our family by our words and our deeds.

Secondly, Moses had a young assistant named Joshua. Joshua was learning about leading God's people by being present when the Lord talked with Moses. He was being trained by being present. Brothers, are there any young men in your life that you are training to lead when your time of service comes to an end? Don't let what you've learned die with you. Joshua was able to lead the people the Promised Land and into battle when Moses time of service came to an end. Why? His faith in God had been developed working with Pastor Moses.

Lastly, and most importantly, Moses communed with God. Moses explicitly followed God's directions, not for his own benefit, but for the benefit of the community of faith. Brothers the Lord wants to use our mouth to speak for Him, our hands to work for Him, and our feet to go for Him. We must first have ears that hear Him and a heart that loves Him.



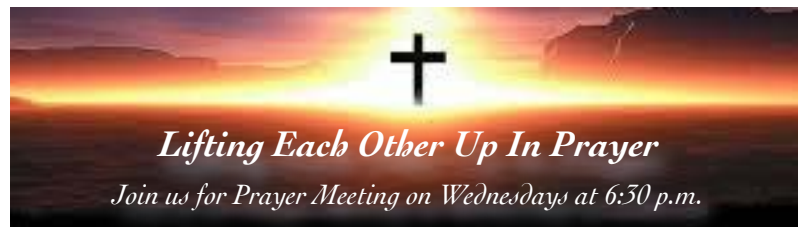
