**Look for the menu and sign-up sheets in the narthex - -- we need to know how many to prepare for.**



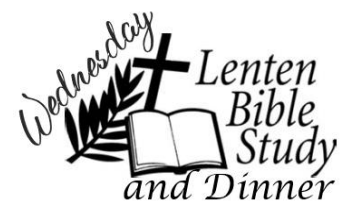

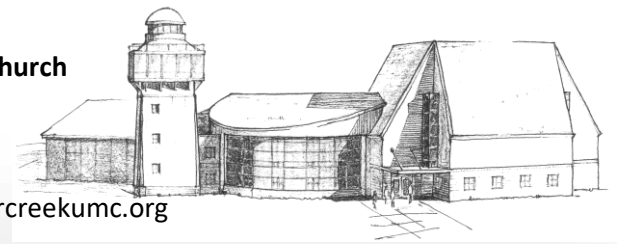
