Auxiliary "Valentine Care Packages"



We realize that your DD-214 contains personal information, which is why we emphasize that you provide a **redacted copy (sensitive information blacked out)**. Copies provided **must** have your name, department, component and branch of service, and record of service dates, **all other personal information may be blacked out**. 


