**A conversation with Ross and Joyce Short**  
**2023 Shoal Lake Ag Society Honorary Parade Marshall's**



**Ross and Joyce Short**

What an honour it was to have a visit with Ross and Joyce Short to gather their story about their involvement in agriculture. Both Ross and Joyce were born and raised in the Shoal Lake district and still reside in their own home in Shoal Lake. They were married in June 1960 and raised 6 very busy children. All 8 members of their family were very involved in 4-H Cattle and all started at a very young age. Add both winter and summer sports and you have a lot of memories and have covered a lot of miles both on foot and in a station wagon!

I am going to try and present their remarkable agricultural story in a timeline. Ross has a fantastic memory and the dates and details are amazing.

**1942** - Ross shows his first calf with the Boys and Girls Club at 8 years old. His dad was a great inspiration for him to get started in a lifelong commitment.

**1948** - It was a Monday night and a storm blew into town. It blew down the full length of the horse barns on the east side of the grounds. Calls went out to anyone and everyone to bring tools to help clear and rebuilt before the Fair on Wednesday. Ross was 14 years old and he was recruited to be the driver of Eddie Arnold's truck to haul over the new wood from the lumber yard. The new barns were up in a matter of hours. It wasn't fancy but it was workable. In no time the horses started arriving for the Fair from Strathclair.

**1952** - Ross first became involved in 4-H. He won the prestigious Gold Watch Award at the Brandon Royal Winter Fair (which he still has!)

**1954** - Ross represented Manitoba at the Royal Winter Fair in Toronto.

**1960's** - Shoal Lake 4-H Beef Club won the top award for the province.

**1964** - Ross became the president of the Shoal Lake Ag Society. Back then the terms were for 2 years.

**1965** - Ross became the 4-H leader for the Shoal Lake Beef Club which spanned 17 memorable years. The club quickly grew from 14 to 28 members.

**1970's** - Joyce became involved with the Shoal Lake Ag Society as the director of the School Art. The set up of the school art worked well into her schedule. She could assist with this the day before which allowed her to tend to her family's activities during fair day.

**1982** - This was to be their last year presenting a 4-H calf. The calf was purchased by a local breeder after it won at the Strathclair Fair. The breeder then went on to place as Champion of the Shorthorn Steer division at the Royal Winter Fair in Toronto.

### **Memorable Moments:**

\*1984 -Our centennial year, Eddie Arnold celebrated his 100th birth year and he was still showing his own Croydon Clydesdales.

\*The Brandon Jumping Horse Show closed the Shoal Lake Fair with a one-hour performance. Late 1940 - 1950: Williamson and McPherson were the special attraction to close the Shoal Lake Fair. Bouncy Buster always came out on top of the Jumping Class.

\*"Sometimes the cattle were easier to train than the kids".

\*The miles that we put on to break calves one week each year before the fair.

\*Famous last words "Hang on, Hang on - don't let go - don't let him get away on you! Kids, I am sure you all remember hearing this over and over.

Thank you Ross and Joyce for your many, many years of dedication to agriculture and sport for the community of Shoal Lake. You are an inspiration to us all!

# Annual Shoal Lake Agricultural Society Fair

## General Rules and Information

***Entry deadline is Monday, July 17, 2023 at 5:00 p.m. NO EXCEPTIONS***

***Late entries will be charged \$10.***

***Entry fees must be paid when animal is entered.***

***Fees will no longer be deducted from winnings. No exceptions.***

***NO ENTRIES ACCEPTED AFTER ENTRY DEADLINE***

- Gate admission entitles one to exhibit in Home Living section and good for one admission to the grounds. 5% of \$5 or over on prize money from Hall will be deducted.
- No animal or article will be admitted which has not a distinguishing number obtained from the Secretary.
- Produce and manufacturers must be delivered to the persons having charge of the show rooms and grounds, or be placed in their respective classes under their direction.
- The Fair Board will allow exhibitors to have two entries per class for a maximum of two classes. These extra entries to be designated by exhibitor as to where they will be shown when making his or her entries. Rule to apply to livestock only.
- Should there be only one exhibitor in any class, or section of a class, the judges are to use their own discretion as to the awarding of a premium, and they may refrain from making an award where they do not think the animal or article worthy.
- No person will be allowed to interfere with the judges while in the discharge of their duties. Should an exhibitor so interfere he will forfeit all claim to any premium to which he might otherwise be entitled.
- Should any fraud, deception or dishonest practice be discovered on the part of any exhibitor or his agent, the Board of Directors may withhold any prize awarded, and may prohibit such exhibitor from exhibiting for such time as they may determine, and may publish the name of such exhibitor should they deem it proper to do so.
- ***No animal shall be taken or removed from the show until after 5:00 p.m. or the stock parade is over without the leave of the President. If the prize animal or article is removed contrary to the rule, the premium awarded for it will become forfeit.***
- The judges are requested to report to the Communiplex on the Fair Grounds to commence duties on the day of exhibition.
- While the directors will take every precaution possible under the circumstances to ensure the safety of articles sent to the exhibition, the owners must take upon themselves the whole risk, and should any article be injured, lost or stolen, while the directors will give every assistance in their power to the restoration thereof, they will not make any payment for the value thereof, or for the injury or loss. Exhibitors, please insure your exhibits.
- Any protests against decisions of the judges must be made in writing and handed to the director in charge within one hour after decision, accompanied with the fee of \$1 which fee will be returned if appeal is sustained.
- Public admitted to the Hall on the day of the show as soon as judging is completed.
- No sideshows admitted to the Fair Grounds unless approved by the directors.
- If any damage, loss or injury to person property shall be proximately caused by reason of neglect of any willful act of any person, firm or corporation, their agents, representatives, servants or employees having license or privilege to exhibit on said exhibition grounds, or occupying space thereon, the Exhibition shall in no manner be responsible therefore, and in case it be subject to any expense or liability, all persons causing the same are liable therefore and shall indemnify the Exhibition.
- ***Respect to fellow exhibitors must be shown at all times. Any disrespect shown to another exhibitor or another exhibitors property will result in forfeiture of winnings to the injured party and immediate eviction from fairgrounds.***

## Rules Pertaining to Livestock

1. In the event of less than two exhibitors in any one class of any section, The Society reserves the right to double up classes or the exhibitor may remain as entered, but only 50% of the prize money will be paid.
2. Brood mares must have a foal at foot, and cows must be giving milk at the time of exhibition or must be evidently well gone in calf.
3. Parties showing purebred stock must produce to the Secretary on entry sheet, name and registered number of the animal, if one year old or over, or statutory declaration for animal under one year, stating that they are entitled to be duly registered.
4. The age of animals on January 1<sup>st</sup> each year must accompany entry.
5. Team horses must be shown in harness and attached to a lumber wagon, carriage or buggy; and saddle horses with their proper equipment.
6. Stock shown must be bonafide, the property of the exhibitor and must have been in his possession one month before the day of the show; and every animal must be shown in the class to which it properly belongs. All brood mares must be shown in teams in their respective classes.
7. Judges have the power to rule out any animal classed improperly. Said animal to show in its proper class.
8. No advance money paid on Fair Day. All cheques must be cashed within 30 days of being issued.
9. All exhibitors must be neatly dressed when exhibiting livestock.
10. Judges will give reasons for awarding prizes to livestock if requested to do so by exhibitors at time of judging.
11. All animals shown must be insured.
12. A local Veterinarian will be available.
13. No one is to leave the grounds through the north east gate during show times. Please use the south east gate if leaving.

## Light Horses

**Notice to Exhibitors – Entry Fee \$2 per class.**

All entries must be paid before the exhibit is judged. Make sure your name and address are on your entry form. Judging starts at 8:00 a.m. day of the fair with Order of Go posted at the barns. Stalls assigned when horses arrive on a first come – first serve basis. Horses must show in the same division in performance as shown on the line. All light stallions over one-year-old must be purebred. All foals must be led on line. The same horse may be entered under English and Western Saddle with a three-minute tack change for cross-entry and strictly monitored.

Do not leave through the north east gate during show times. Please leave through south east gate.  
**In case of a rain cancellation, please pick up refund before leaving grounds or you will not receive a refund.**

## **MGRA General Rules**

1. Exhibitor ages 18 & under and 12 & under as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of current year.
2. The age for Junior Horse is to be noted as 5 years and under. The horse or pony is to be ridden in a snaffle bit or bosal, with two hands.
3. Horses to be shown under clean serviceable western tack.
4. Contestants must appear in clean, neat western attire (western hat & boots, colored pants, denim blue jeans worn only with chaps, and long sleeve shirt).
5. In all events western hats are to be worn crossing the start line.
6. Contestants may be disqualified for abusing horses in any manner. Disqualification will result from contestant hitting his or her horse in front of cinch or going off pattern during a race.
7. A horse cannot be ridden by more than one rider in the same class, but a contestant may ride a limit of two horses in each class (both to be saddled).
8. Western Pleasure – flat footed walk, jog, lope, both ways of the ring, on a reasonably loose rein and on the correct lead at all times. Only one hand on the reins (Split reins or roman, no tie downs, running martingales).
9. Reining courses are set with markers on the wall. Horses are disqualified for not following the exact pattern, riders changing hands on the reins, using two hands or whipping horses. In reining Pattern #5, the spins have been reduced to 2 spins each, direction.
10. Pole bending course consists of six poles 21 feet apart and 21 feet from the starting/finishing line. Knocking over a pole adds a three second penalty and riders are disqualified for going off pattern, touching any pole with a hand or crossing the finishing line before the course is finished.
11. Men's, Ladies', Junior' and Pee Wee Barrel racing – either barrel one or two may be taken first but contestants will be disqualified for not following the cloverleaf course. A five second penalty is given for each barrel knocked over, but a contestant may, from a riding position, hold a barrel from falling. The Start-Stop line has been increased to 45 feet, this distance has priority over pattern distance between barrels.
