THE FOLLOWING POINT SYSTEM QUALIFICATIONS AND RULES

APPLY TO ALL YEAR-END AWARDS

1. Any registered tentative, **permanent, foundation, CPO or Performance Permit** horse in the Appaloosa Horse Club, including breeding stock is eligible to show and accumulate points provided the owner or lessee of the horse is an E Wa member in good standing, and has met all requirements necessary to declare said horse(s) in writing with the Points Chairperson. Year end points application must be completed and returned in order for points at a show to count. May be turned in with results of first show attended- Note - Breeding Stock is eligible to show in Open Shows and Saddle Log - ONLY..

When an E Wa member's horse is sold or leased during the show season to a non-member, the accumulated points will go with the horse if the new owner becomes a member and declares his horse in writing within 10 days of the date of purchase. New owner must provide a copy of updated registration papers showing proof of ownership within 45 days from date of purchase.

Lessee must submit proof of lease to the Points Chairperson to be eligible for year-end awards.

2.a. When a horse is owned by an E Wa member and is sold or leased to an E Wa member, points go with the horse and the new owner/lessee has to inform the Points Chairperson within 10 days of purchase. New owner must provide copy of updated registration papers showing proof of ownership within 45 days from the date of purchase. Points will continue to count uninterrupted from date of purchase.

2.b. If a horse is bought/leased during the show season, points will count from date of purchase or lease if the person is already an E Wa member and declares the horse within 10 days of purchase/lease. New owner must provide a copy of updated registration papers showing proof of ownership within 45 days from date of purchase.

3. In the event of a complaint of rules or question about the tabulation of points which can not be solved by the Points Chairperson, a written report must be made to the President who will appoint a committee (usually the Board) to review the complaint. Their decision will be final.

4. In order for a member to win a year-end award, he/she must attend at least three (3) meeting or provide a sponsorship, or work a minimum of 4 hours at any E Wa show.

5. In the event of a tie for the entire season, the horse winning its points in the least number of shows shall be declared the winner. If a tie still exists, the horse with the most 1sts, 2nds, 3rds, etc. will win. If a double tie still exists, duplicate awards will be given.

6. It will be the responsibility of the Points Chairperson to tabulate the points earned for every E Wa member who has met all requirements of declaring in writing his horse(s) with the Points Chairperson. The Points Chairperson will send written verification to each applicant that all requirements have been or have not been met. If the exhibitor has not heard from the Points Chairperson within 20 days after sending in a declaration, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to contact the Points Chairperson.

THE FOLLOWING APPLY TO APPALOOSA BREED SHOWS ONLY:

1. All E Wa approved Appaloosa shows must be ApHC approved shows.
2. An approved list of shows for the season will be provided by the Board of Directors.
3. Only placing's through 6th will count towards points; except in youth classes if classes are combined as 18 & Under. Points will be counted per attached chart.
4. In order for a horse or rider to win a year-end award in a particular class, the following rules apply:
 - a. Earn points in at least six (6) shows
 - b. Only the top fifteen (15) shows to count
 - c. Top fifteen (15) shows are based on how many points earned at a show, not placing's.
 - d. Multiple-point shows will count appropriately; i.e. a double Judge show counts as 2 shows; a 4-Judge shows will count as 4 shows, etc.
 - ~~e. Shows that the ApHC has designated a Judge as double pointed shall count as 2 shows.~~
5. In the event of the Appaloosa Horse Club (ApHC) add a new class during the show year, the Board of Directors may add the class to receive year end awards.

HALTER Division:

1. An appropriate year-end award will be given to the highest point earning horse in each of the following classes.

Only those classes marked with an asterisk count towards High Point Horse awards. Money/Stake classes do not count.

HIGH POINT ALL-AROUND HORSE AND RESERVE: The stallion, mare or gelding receiving the highest number of points in all the performance classes marked with an asterisk listed under the **DIVISIONS**, will be declared **HIGH POINT ALL-AROUND HORSE** of the Club and will receive an appropriate award. The horse receiving the second highest number of points as outlined above will be declared the **RESERVE HIGH-POINT ALL-AROUND HORSE** of the Club. A horse must earn at least 5 points in five (5) classes to receive the High Point All-Around Horse.

HIGH POINT ENGLISH HORSE: In order to qualify, a horse must earn at least 5 points in 3 classes of the following divisions Hunter In Hand, English Pleasure Division and English Action. Hunter In Hand classes to count for High Point English Horse but not required. Only classes marked with an asterisk to count.

HIGH POINT WESTERN HORSE: In order to qualify, a horse must earn at least 5 points in 4 classes of the following divisions: **Halter, Western Pleasure, Western Action, Games or Working**, Halter classes to count for High Point Western Horse but not required. Only classes marked with an asterisk to count.

WORLD Show Nominations: A horse may qualify for the World Championship Appaloosa Halter and Performance Horse Show (Nominations). See current National Rule Book. The National cut-off date for World Nomination qualification is August 31st of each year or see National Rule Book. Any points earned after that date will count for the following year.

THE FOLLOWING CONTINUES TO APPLY TO APPALOOSA BREED SHOWS:

YOUTH AWARDS: Youth riders have to file declaration forms with the Points Chairperson as per Rules No. 1 & 2, along with their age. Youths ride as of age at January 1st.

In order for a rider to be eligible for year-end awards, each rider must earn points in 6 shows. Points to be tabulated per chart. Only E Wa approved Appaloosa shows to count. See Rule No. 11. In classes that allow a rider to ride more than one (1) horse, only the highest placing for that class to count at that show.

High Point Youth Award: All youth classes to count except Novice and Walk/trot. Must earn 5 points in 5 classes to qualify for award. A high point award will be given to the highest point earning youth exhibitor in both 13 & Under and 14-18.

Youth Classes: The following classes will receive an appropriate year end award in each division of 13 & Under and 14-18 unless otherwise stated.

NON-PRO AWARDS: Non-Pro Points will be accumulated from Non-Pro classes. Non-Pro riders have to file declaration forms with the Points Chairperson, indicating their age group and horses to be used. A Non-Pro is anyone who qualifies under the Appaloosa National Rules. Horse used in the Non-Pro must qualify under the National Rules as stated in Section 900. In classes that allow a rider to ride more than one (1) horse, only the highest placing for that class to count at that show. Non-Pro Walk/Trop riders do not need to own horse to earn points for year-end.

High Point Non-Pro: A high point award will be given to the Non-Pro. In order to be eligible for the Non-Pro High Point Award, you must earn a minimum of five (5) points in at least five (5) Non-Pro classes. High Point will be based on exhibitor

TRAIL RIDE AWARDS

1. **Competitive Rides** - Must be approved NATRC rides - Horse with highest number of points won on competitive rides as confirmed by an official NATRC publication to win award. Open to all horses registered with the Appaloosa Horse Club. Proof of points required.
2. **Endurance Rides** - Must be approved AERC rides. Minimum length of ride must be 50 miles in one day. Horse with highest number of points won on endurance rides as confirmed by an official of the ride, to win award. Open to all horses registered with the Appaloosa Horse Club. State (Cal-Western) rules to be used for computing points. Must ride in at least 2 rides.
3. **Trail Trials** - A trail ride with obstacles, that are man-made or natural. Judging based on your ability to negotiate each obstacle. Must place in at least three (3) rides. Proof of placing required. Only places through 5th will count in 17 & Under, 18 to 39, 40 - 59 and 60 & Over in Novice, Intermediate and Advanced Categories. Only CSHA rides are eligible for points.

Competition will be from January 1st thru December 31st. Horse owner is responsible to furnish the Points Chairperson with results which must be postmarked 30 days after date of ride. Points accumulated in December, must be postmarked by *January 15th* of the following year, to count.

FUTURITY/MATURITY SPECIAL RECOGNITION: A special recognition will be given to any eligible horse(s) that place in any Futurity or Maturity. An award maybe given to any eligible horse(s) that wins any futurity or maturity. The horse owner/lessee is responsible for notifying the Points Chairperson in thirty days of the event and by January 5th of any event held in December.

* * * * *

RACING: Awards will be given each year to the qualified race horses who win the greatest number of dollars under pari-mutual racing by age group. Awards to be given to horses 2 years, 3 years, and 4 years and older. Horse owner is responsible to furnish the Points Chairperson with proof of dollars won. To be eligible for year-end award, horse must have raced in 2 or more races. Racing competition will be from November 1st thru October 31st. Racing results must be postmarked by November 10th to count.

*** * * THIS SECTION APPLIES TO OPEN ALL BREED SHOWS * * ***

OPEN SHOW COMPETITION:

Object: To select champion halter & performance Appaloosa Horses earning points in competition with other breeds in open shows. Open to all horses registered with the Appaloosa Horse Club, including breeding stock.

Point Qualification & Rules:

1. Points must be earned in any open show. Open Show is a show open to any horse or rider.
2. Open Show Points form must be filled out and returned to the Points Chairperson within 30 days of the show. Except in the month of December, where they must be postmarked no later than January 15th.
3. A copy of the show premium must be returned to the Points Chairperson with the Show point form, signed by the Show Secretary.
4. Only places through 6th will count
5. If the horse or rider goes in more than one class within a division (such as Pleasure, Equitation, Trail, etc.), only the highest placing will count at each show.
6. Classes not to count: Gimmick, Training, warm-up, Appaloosa, Any Color Class, or any restricted class.
7. The show season for Open Competition will begin January 1st and end December 31st.
8. Walk/Trot, Walk/Jog, and Walk Only classes do not count for horse/rider combination High Points.
9. Individual Class Awards
 - a. Youth & Amateur classes are based on exhibitor and may show any number of declared horses.
 - b. Open classes are tabulated on the horse and may have any number of declared exhibitors show.
 - c. You must receive points at 4 shows in order to qualify in a class for year end.

HIGH POINT AWARDS

All High Point Awards must earn five (5) points in a minimum of three (3) of the classes with a minimum of four (4) shows in each class or award will not be given. Any restricted show, i.e. 4-H, FFA, etc. will NOT count for the classes listed below. **MUST** earn points in 4 shows in each class & age breakdown. All High Point Awards are based on horse/rider combinations and will be awarded in the following categories.

Western Horse & Rider combination

17 & Under (13 & U/ 14-17 classes only),
18 & Over classes Adult/Amateur & Open

English Horse & Rider combination

17 & Under (13 & U/ 14-17 classes only),
18 & Over classes Adult/Amateur & Open

Youth Awards

- Lead Line** Youth 6 or under - not to show in any other riding class. Awards to be given in three divisions: Equitation, Pleasure and Trail. Both English & Western shows count.
- Walk Only** Youth 8 & under- not to show in any riding classes requiring a trot, jog, lope or canter. Awards to be given in three divisions: Equitation, Pleasure and Trail. Both English & Western shows count.
- Walk-Trot** Youth 10 or under - not to show in any classes requiring a lope or canter

- 4-H Award** Shows restricted to 4-H members only - the four (4) show rule DOES NOT count

The awards and certificates will be determined by committee due to the unknown level of interest this new program will generate. The National Saddle Log Program is a separate entity and enrollment in the E Wa program does not enroll the participant in the national program.
