### **Members Reports**

Pacific Dawn Trip 04-12-2010 By James Ward Pictures by Rich Jenkins

It was a dark and stormy night, then came a knock on the door. OH! NO. This is not a murder mystery—this was our overnight fishing trip. Storm warnings, small craft warnings, rain to noon on fishing day, that was the forecast, but here is the way it played out.

Rain on the way to Ventura. Light rain getting the gear to the boat. The skipper pushed the departure time to 1:00am expecting a break in the weather. Cold clear and calm on the ocean.

The first stop was for white fish, and they were hungry. The next move was for Rock Cod and other bottem fish in shallow water.

About 9:00am, the sun came out and heavy jackets came off. Soon the fish began to hit the decl. Mike Maurizio brought the first Ling Cod. He later added 3 more. All caught on a 10" orange plastic. Rich Jenkins was the next with a Ling, a very ugly green one, but they cook up nice and white. At least 8 Lings were caught all small about 6 to 8 pounds. But all legal size.

Kama, Christina, and Kaile all make a run for the jackpot. I was lucky, to beat out Kaile for the jackpot. We both had large Sheepheads. Christina distinguished herself by catching the only Sole. Karma out-fished her husband on every drop.

The boat had its quota of Rock Fish. So we moved to the Halibut area, but hit a dry spot. At 3:00pm, time to head for

Lake El Salto Sinaloa Mexico By Ed Cazares

Wow where can I start, I had the opportunity to travel south of the border with my good friend Scott Smith and a couple of good friends who had never caught to many largemouth before. We traveled last month to one of the most tranquil and relaxing get aways ive ever encountered. Don't get me wrong it was a lot of work to get up at 4:30 every morning and have breakfast served in time to get on the water as the sun rose up behind the beautiful Sierra Madre mountains. Even though we always came in for lunch, fishing until the sun goes down everyday for five days can be real tough on a



We fished hard and our efforts paid off handsomely. The weather in Mexico is perfect this time of year with air temps in the low 50's at sunrise and mid 80's in the afternoon. We stayed at Pro Bass Adventures right on lake El Salto and encountered Mexico fishing mixed with hospitality you wouldn't even believe possible.

the barn. Fish Tacos on the way in. Yum yum.

Glen Bummer had a wrist watch the size of a biscuit. It had among many other things a compass. Glenn tied to convince us that the boat was going Northwest and we were headed to Hawaii.

At the dock in Ventura, not Hawaii, the fish were delivered super cold to the parking lot. Evryone had a limit of Rock Cod plus an assortment5 of other bottom fish. What a nice weather turn aroung and what a nice day to be fishing with friends on the Pacific Dawn.











We fished everything from Top water poppers, Buzz baits and walking baits to every hard bait and plastic bait imaginable. The primary El Salto patterns were Top water, Spinner baits, Lizards and Senkos with a majority of the big ones coming by way of Spinner baits and Lizards texas rigged or C-rigged. Ninety percent of the big fish came from within the trees and in the thick heavy cover of the under water tree forest. You had about two seconds to make sure your hooked fish would turn and come towards you and not sideways, that was the challenge because the two pounders fought as hard as any five pounders you've ever hooked.













Our guide Esteban has been guiding on this lake for twenty years and played in the old valley as a young boy before the dams were built in the city which now lies underwater. The house he grew up in is near the old river down about 50'-60' or so below the water along with the entire village that used to be old El Salto. He knows every bend and every under water piece of structure on the entire lake. As far as the fish went, well they were all "Muy Grande"! There were a lot of









two to four pounders so you couldn't let your guard down because you never knew what would bite next. And when I say alot believe me it was alot.





We had so many eight pounders I couldnt keep track. All I know is on the first day I had three eight plus pounders, four seven plus pounders and way over a couple of dozen five and six pounders and then from then on it was a blur. My left hand and thumb were numb from lipping so many big fish I had to ask our guide to remove the hooks after only two days of fishing. It was like I died and went to heaven. I hooked multiple giants well over 10lbs and some that im sure were teenagers but I never got one in the boat due to the super thick heavy cover of the forest. It didnt really matter to me because it was just as pleasurable to feel them rock me like no other!


### Quick report from an old guy: By Big Ed

Lake Crowley for the opener was slow, we manged a couple of fish per rod Saturday 4/24/10 but that was it. They say since the lake melted only six to seven days prior to our arrival the fish were not ready. It was my first time fishing the Sierra's. We fished down below in the river and up in the creeks for excellent action on brook trout, rainbows and a few browns. It was beautifull, I want to go back.





Diamond Valley Lake has treated me well for the past month or two. It is not wide open by any means but there are good fish to be had like this one that fell for a 12" Texas rigged margarita mutilator fished in about 20' of water.









The people who run this resort are all the finest human beings you would ever want to meet. Even though you could walk from your room to the dining room they were always there to drive you in the buggy or the van. You could not lift a bag, carry a bag or rod or even hardly get your own cerveza out of the ice cooler. Oh, and those cervezas and margaritas were as endless as the fish on the other end of your line. Our guide Esteban told me in twenty years guiding at this lake he has never seen anybody stick two cervezas in their mouth at the same time and drink them in under three seconds with one tilt of the head. Should I be ashamed or proud? Only one day out of the four and a half days was the fishing a bit slow

I will say this year just like last year is late. What normally has happened in earlier months historically is just starting to happen as we speak. Its weird, mother nature doesn't use our time clock she does what she wants, kind of like my wife!

I am a board member for our local little league, a fulltime umpire umpiring all over the SGV and I barely have time to work and hold down a family. Hope to see you all at the next meeting!
