Pursuing a career in nursing will undeniably have its challenges. What shouldn't be a challenge is finding the financial resources to help achieve career goals.



Applications must be submitted by February 28 of each year. Scholarship winners are determined by the Foundation board of directors. Scholarship funds may only be used by students to pay for tuition, fees, books, supplies, and equipment and is paid directly to the educational institution.

To be considered for a scholarship, applicants must meet specific eligibility criteria, including academic excellence, and must pursue study at an accredited college on a full-time or part-time basis in a nursing program relevant to long term care. Preference is given to those individuals currently working in or demonstrating an interest in pursuing a career in long term care.
