C. Consider and Discuss Project Updates for the Following Projects: Lake Patrol; Williamson Dam; Wastewater Treatment Plant; Exit 330 Westbound; Airport Paving; Annexation of Airport and Hidden Shores; and Streets.

Mr. Archer gave the following updates:

Lake Patrol—boat was ordered and shipped and should arrive in Cisco Friday. The city has sold 129 permits since enacting the new ordinance. People have asked about day passes so the Council may want to consider that in the future. Public Works has been clearing brush and mowing and the boat dock has been moved. New signage has been erected.

Williamson Dam-Grant was received and assessment with physical inspection will begin September 14, 2020.

Wastewater Treatment Plant—Project from 5 years ago before the flood so now we are coming back around to the Wastewater Plant. Pre-Construction meeting will take place August 14, 2020.

Exit 330 Westbound—Will be moved back 3000 feet to the east by TxDOT. The project should take approximately 24 months.

Airport Paving—Start date for paving on September 26, 2020 and will be complete on or about October 20, 2020.

Annexation of Airport and Hidden Shores—met with County Surveyor and property will be surveyed within 30 days. Annexation should be complete by the end of October.

Streets—On track to complete 6 miles of paving of the streets this year.

VII. BUDGET AND TAX RATE WORKSHOP

Mr. Archer began the budget workshop and he and the Council considered each line item in order to finalizing the budget for the upcoming 2020-2021 budget year. Mr. Archer specified changes that resulted in the need for additional revenue including the Municipal Court Judge becoming a full time position instead of part time, the creation of a lake patrol division, having two elections in one fiscal year, and the hiring of three new fire fighters.

A. Consider and Discuss Setting Proposed Tax Rate.

Mr. Archer explained the new laws for setting a tax rate. He went on to enumerate the taxable value for the city and indicated that it was down around \$7.5 million dollars from the previous year. He stated for the record that the no new revenue tax rate for the year is \$0.664581 and that the voter approval rate is \$0.687841. He closed by commenting that the tax rate necessary to support the 2020-2021 proposed budget is \$0.687840.

Motion was made by Councilmember R. Johnson to set the proposed tax rate at \$0.687840, second was made by Councilmember Forester. Motion prevailed by the following vote:
