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PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"You are standing firm in one spirit, striving side by side with one mind for the faith of the gospel..." (Philippians 1:27)

The April Session meeting was one of the latest or longest Session meetings I can remember since I have moderated here in Bismarck. I have not kept personal *records* of these "time milestones" either here or in other churches. I do remember from other locations, some tense church Sessions or grim situations that pushed meetings deeper into the night.

PASTOR SEARCH COMMITTEE NEWS

The Pastor Search Committee has completed the Ministry Information Form (MIF) and obtained the Session approval of this essential document that provides information to interested candidates regarding our church and its needs, the position description for the pastor for our church, and information regarding compensation. The MIF must be approved by the Presbytery's Committee On Ministry (COM) before it can be placed on the denomination's network where prospective candidates can gain access to the MIF. COM will meet on May 11, 2017. After receiving COM approval, the approved MIF can be uploaded into the denomination's network and it can also be sent directly to other presbyteries where it can be accessed by other interested candidates. If a candidate wishes to be considered for the position of pastor in our church, they must send their resume or Personal Information Form (PIF) to the Search Committee. The denomination will perform a computer matching of our church's MIF with pastors who have placed their PIF on the network. The Search Committee will receive the PIF's for those that appear to be a good match for our church. The Pastor Search Committee expects to begin receiving and evaluating PIF's from the denomination and prospective candidates during the next several weeks/months and will be reviewing them as they are received.

The Internet and Technical Data Sub-committee of the Pastor Search Committee will also update information on the church's website and will be monitoring its Facebook page for those prospective candidates choosing to use social media.

The Search Committee review of PIF's continues until candidates are identified who appear to be best qualified for the position of pastor in our church. Presbytery resources are used to conduct background checks on a shortlist of candidates and the Search Committee contacts personal and professional references before finalizing its evaluation of a candidate, conducting interviews, arranging for a neutral pulpit appearance for a candidate and beginning the negotiation of a Call.

The Search Committee intends to communicate its progress with the congregation with articles in the monthly newsletter and by making periodic progress reports during Sunday worship. We continue to ask for your prayers and support as we progress with efforts to call our next pastor.

Not a lot of church youth groups have leaders from across the state planning events for them to connect with youth across the Presbytery-but our youth group does! This past year, the "Youth Connection Team" of the Presbytery of the Northern Plains has planned three separate retreats, and summer mission trip opportunities for Middle and High School youth! This momentum comes after a great experience last summer traveling with 16 youth to Triennium. We all agreed that the greatest highlight of Triennium was seeing our youth from various congregations get to know each other, and create relationships amongst the chaos of a large youth conference!

Since then, we hosted a Fall Retreat in the Badlands of Medora, and a "Rest Fest" Retreat at a winter home in Minnesota. Each retreat brought together kids from large congregations, and small. We brought together high school, and middle school, youth-all in the name of God. The end of April brings our annual Spring Retreat, help at Crystal Springs Retreat Center, near Medina. The Presbytery has hosted this retreat for over 20 years, and is an exciting time for our youth to reconnect, and get to know each other better, all while

exploring their faith. This spring, our theme is: "Sing, Shout, Make Music", and we welcome a Worship and Youth Pastor to share music and great discussion on music and worship. We are welcoming about 40 youth from North Dakota, and Minnesota, and hope the cold kick leaves us alone for the few days we are together.

This summer, we are inviting High School youth to a week in Denver, volunteering with a Vacation Bible School, and learning from various non-profit organizations and charities. Our Middle School youth will be enjoying a long weekend in Minneapolis, doing various mission work throughout the weekend. Both opportunities bring our youth together to travel, enjoy new cities, and understand their faith in the new light of mission work. We are excited for the youth who are taking part in these trips, and encourage you to reach out to any young people you know who may be interested!

Our youth are very blessed to have so many wonderful opportunities, and we are thankful for a congregation and Presbytery that supports our youth in so many ways. We ask for your prayers this month as we Confirm our three 8th grade students, and celebrate the Graduation of three High School Seniors! All six of these youth are very active in PresbyTeens, and it is exciting to celebrate these rights of passage within their lives, and in their faith.

- Currently there are 52 children enrolled in the Child Care Center with ages ranging from 0-5.
- The Child Care Center has 24 employees, of which 11 are full-time and 13 are part-time.
- FPCCC is currently working on the second of four steps of the Bright & Early program. The Bright & Early 4-Star Rating System helps parents and providers assess how a child care program supports a child's early learning and development. For more information visit www.brightnd.org.
- The children have been busy celebrating Earth Day by learning about the environment, reusing, reducing and recycling. Their recent activities have included a garbage clean-up day, creating junk art, nature appreciation and a twigs and rocks center.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS April 25, 2017

CONFIRMATION

Session met with the three students who will be confirmed on May 7: Corby Svihovec, TJ Davis, and Kathryn Brown. The students shared their faith statements and were accepted as new members of the church.

CLERK'S REPORT

Membership will increase to 515 with the addition of three confirmation students.

PASTOR'S REPORT

Session members were asked to identify current issues and ways to solve them for the "What's Next" step to be discussed in May. Pastor Reiter will be away May 8-16 in San Francisco for Continuing Education and in San Diego visiting family.

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS (from committee minutes and meeting) **Business and Finance**—Income continues to be above budget and expenses below.

Stewardship—Per capita income receipts are at 56% of the goal. Stewardship campaigns are being studied.

Administrative and Personnel—The staff job descriptions will be uniform in the Operations Manual; task lists will be in a separate staff folder. Advertising for the Parish Nurse will appear in the Bismarck Tribune for 2 weeks. The search for an organist continues with mailings to various universities. The estimate from Computer One for Wi Fi throughout the church was \$6000; a second estimate will be sought.

Christian Education—Some clarifications were made to the Child and Youth Protection Policies. Nine youth have registered for the Crystal Springs Retreat.

Property and Equipment—Session approved a sub-committee led by Sue Sorlie to investigate the replacement of the sofas in the parlor.

Outreach—The committee will donate \$500 to the Soup Café and \$500 to Ministries on the Margin. The congregation will be asked to donate items for the Community Action Backpack Program.



REPORTS OF RELATED GROUPS

Child Care Center Board—Outdoor Classroom campaign has reached nearly \$10,000. The Boy Scouts will build a sandbox if materials are provided. "Donor" letters are being sent to businesses and parents of "alumni".

Fine Arts Festival—Gaylene Massey reported to Session that the committee will hold a festival October 27-28 focused on visual and performing arts. Featured artists, Plein Air, will help with set up/take down. There will be no high tea or other gift galleries. The committee has 4 congregation members and 2 from the community. Session approved the use of Fine Arts Festival funds for 3 scholarships, \$500 each, that will be made available through the following organizations: Central Dakota Children's Choir; Capital Shakespeare Youth Traveling Troop; Theo Art School. These agencies will give the money to children who could not otherwise afford to participate in their programs.

CHURCH OPERATIONS MANUAL

The newly revised manual was given to each Elder with the understanding the old ones would be destroyed.

Fred Larson will bring a unified statement on drug/alcohol/smoking policy, for the operations manual, to the May meeting. Session voted to place the Fine Arts Festival Committee on the organizational chart directly responsible to Session. They will continue to supply minutes of meetings, present to Session plans for an event, a budget and request for expenditures beyond the scope of the event/project.

PRESBYTERY MEETING

Ella Gutzke and Jim Skaret reported on the Presbytery meeting held in West Fargo. Session approved Jim and Ella as the church Commissioners to Presbytery for this year. Pastor Reiter spoke about visiting with the person at the West Fargo church in charge of streaming their worship service. This might be something FPC Bismarck could explore.

PASTOR SEARCH COMMITTEE

Jim Skaret, Chair, presented the Ministry Information Form and Session approved. The MIF will be sent to Presbytery COM (Committee on Ministry) for approval.


