

from John 21:1-13

The man on the shore was Jesus. The helpers were happy to be with Jesus. They knew Jesus is alive!





Find Jesus' Empty Tomb! Use three cereal bowls to symbolize a tomb. Find two pictures to represent a person and tape them in the bottom of two bowls. (Or use plastic toy persons to put underneath two bowls.) Mix the tombs around and have children guess which tomb is Jesus' empty tomb! Read the Bible story from John 21:1-13 together.



Use these thoughts at mealtimes, bedtimes, or other times when you pray with your child this week.
