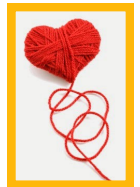

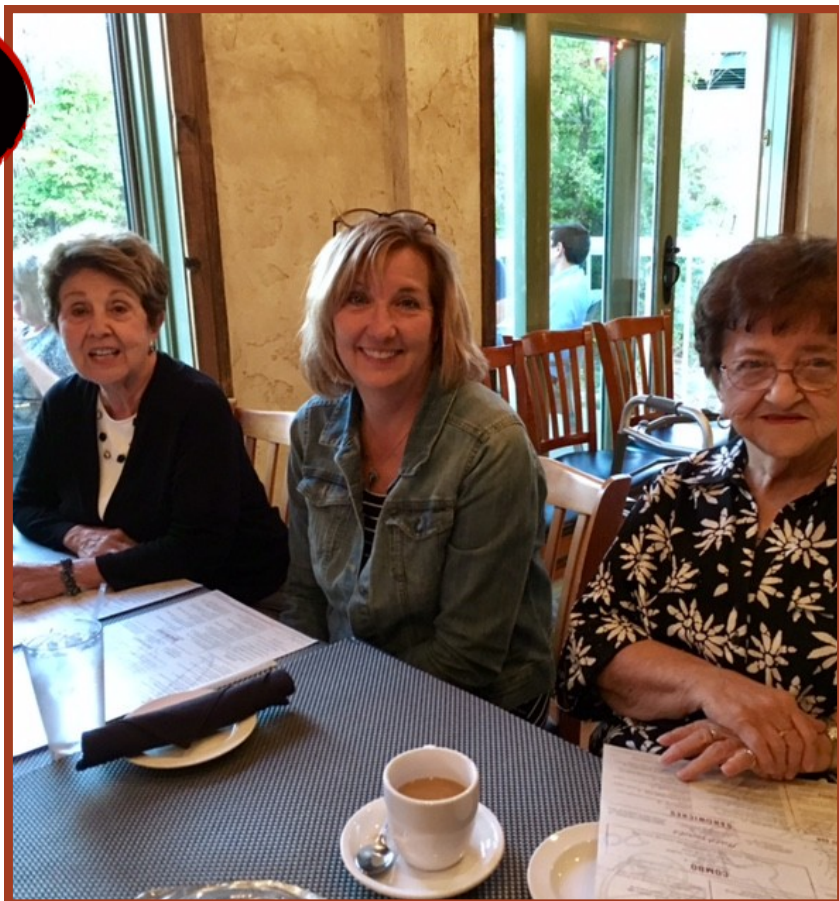

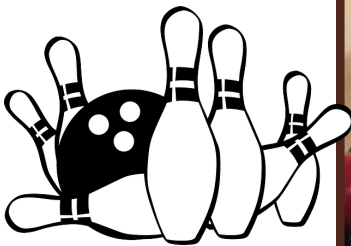

OPENING:

Mike Yaquinto opened the meeting with a word of prayer and a devotion.

ACCEPTANCE OF MINUTES:

The minutes from the September council meeting were approved as submitted. Gary Reynolds motioned to approve the minutes and Scott Schlea seconded. Motion passed.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Scott Schlea presented the financial reports. Council will review and approve them at next month's meeting.

2018 BUDGET:

Pastor, Scott Schlea, and Mike Yaquinto met to begin budget discussions. A draft of that budget was presented to Council. Scott reviewed the preliminary budget, which was missing projected revenue. Pledges will be turned in the week before our congregational meeting. Revenue figures will be added at that time. Historical data was used for discussion purposes. All agreed we need to continue to be good stewards of our finances. Council discussed, then agreed, that we should go 100% electronic for all internal notices and reminders (e.g. ushers, acolytes, etc.). This will make our communications more efficient and save on postage. For those members not online, we will continue to mail postcards. Council discussed ministry budgets and spending and agreed that requests of \$100 or more should be submitted to the office for review and approval a week in advance of needing the funds. Council will review requests electronically and the office will reply to the ministry chair. Once approved, money will be withdrawn from available designated funds for that ministry, then from budget money. Jane will request updated ministry budgets for 2018. Mike Yaquinto suggested Council dedicate one meeting each quarter to our finances. All members agreed. Don Brooker suggested the first meeting be in January to review the end of 2017. Don Brooker motioned to approve the 2018 tentative budget and Gary Reynolds seconded. Motion passed.

FACILITY TASK FORCE UPDATES

Joan Conaway has volunteered to lead the Facility Task Force. Todd Yaquinto will serve as a design consultant to the Facility Task Force and present suggestions for updating the church using Facility Task Force ideas.

PASTOR'S REPORT:

Pastor John sent his Pastor's Report electronically for our review, which included pastoral acts, worship, visitations, consultations, meetings/activities, trips and other.

NEW BUSINESS

In her new position as Director of Witness and Community Involvement, Carol Yaquinto suggested hiring a nursery coordinator to cover the adult Sunday school and 11:00 service hours. This would encourage more adults with young families to attend Sunday School and cover the service with the most infants and young children. She would also like to create a coffee station with café tables to enhance fellowship after service as well as create a cookie ministry that would gather to bake cookies for each Sunday.

Scott Schlea motioned to adjourn the meeting and Sandee Davis seconded. Motion passed. The next Council meeting will be November 14, 2017. Council adjourned.
