LOIS HORN



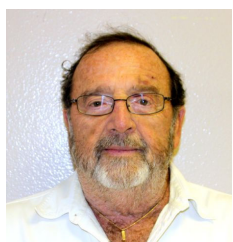
Lois was born in the Bronx but her family moved west when she was 2 years old. When she was in the 6th grade her family moved to Van Nuys and she hasn't strayed very far.

RANDEE SAMSKY HILBORNE

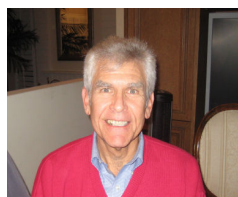

four homes and their history from the area (\$3 per person). Be sure to sign up for these tours if you are interested so we can send in a head count.

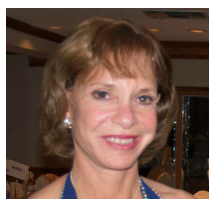

Here's some interesting information about **PEANUT BUTTER:**

We've all known and loved peanut butter since childhood, but did you ever wonder how it came about? It actually dates back to Aztec times. They would roast peanuts and mash them into a flavorful paste to eat. But many people have been credited as creator of peanut butter - among them inventor George Washington Carver. In 1895 Dr. John Kellogg (the creator of Kellogg's cereal) patented a process for creating peanut butter. He marketed it as a healthy protein substitute for patients without teeth. Some trivia: U.S. is the third largest producer of peanuts. More than half of the American peanut crop goes into making peanut butter. U.S. presidents Jimmy Carter and Thomas Jefferson were peanut farmers. It takes about 540 peanuts to make a 12 ounce jar of peanut butter.

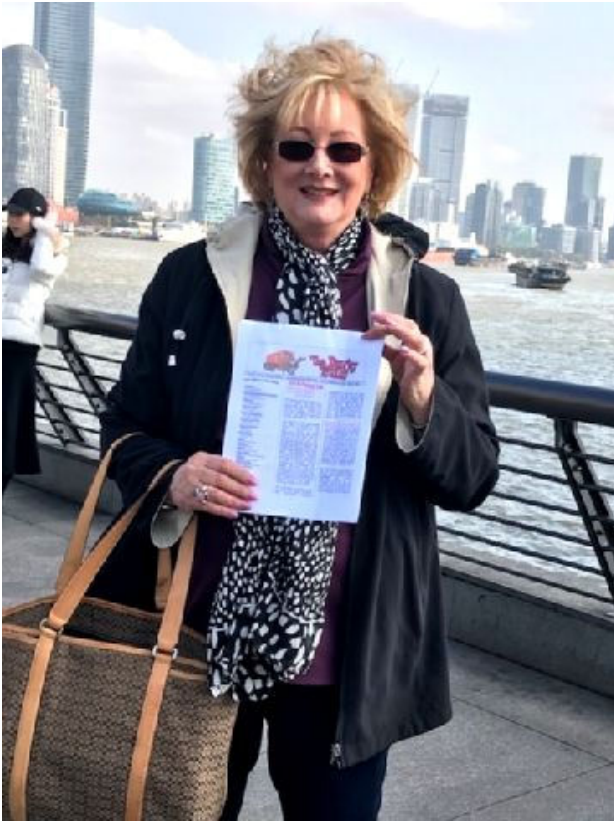

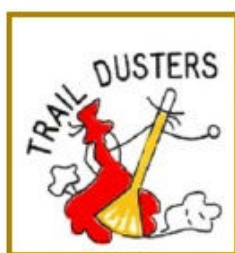

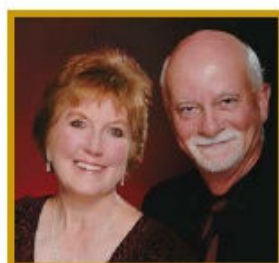
