

32ND SUNDAY: DEDICATION OF ST. JOHN LATERAN

This week, I want to focus on things happening in the parish and our Vicariate or Deanery.

SCHOOL TANK REMOVAL

This past week, North Eastern Environmental, Inc. came to dig out the 5,000 gallon oil tank buried in front of the school. It was used to store oil for the old boiler that was replaced earlier this year. The total cost for conversion to gas boiler was \$122,029.00. This current project will cost us close to \$10,000.00 in the end. We'd have left it there and let the "sleeping dog lie" but the City had already planned to cite us on that. If you remember they cited us for the rectory oil tank forcing us to remove it last year at the cost of \$6,075.00.

FUNDRAISING FOR ST. BART'S

Every parish has fundraising activities each year. Parishes with schools tend to have more organized activities, developed over the years. Almost always, once a parish looses its school, such fundraising activities dwindle and often die. I always believe that every parish should explore a few solid fundraising opportunities, taking their demographics into consideration, and then select two or three and build them up as the years go by. And to do that, a group of devoted parishioners should be commissioned to serve as a Fundraising Committee under the direction of the Finance Council.

Here at St. Bart's, as part of the new Parish Pastoral Plan, we have formed a new Fundraising Committee. We will introduce them in the coming weeks and commission them. They have started meeting. One of their first orders of business was to explore some fundraising options available to us. The final 5 are:

Penny Social (Sweepstakes) – this has been our best fundraiser for years. Last year we netted a little over \$8,000 from the event.

50-50: This has been a regular event but will need to be re-evaluated. Last year we netted \$2,000 from it.

Raffle Scratch-Offs: This is a new one we're introducing this year, beginning this Sunday. Please give it your support. We're hoping that it will be fun and worthwhile for the parish. If it works, it could become a regular. Good thing is that it will not require lots of personnel and physical work. It will be less time consuming too, something that affects all of us nowadays.

Dances: This has come up several times. We'll be exploring it. The good thing with this is that it will draw from non-parishioners and we have parishioners who are willing and excited to help make it a good source of income for the parish. Details are yet to be fleshed out.

Concerts: One is already in the works. Two of our new parishioners, Frank and Wilfredo are working hard to bring some musician friends to perform a concert for the parish. This will also be targeting non parishioners.

Bingo (the whole nine yards) and a Murder Mystery Shows are being considered, too.

Every parish has things breaking down or needing improvement and we're not exempt. Extra fundraisers, especially ones that will attract non parishioners will help to take care of needed expenses.

MAKING ALL THINGS NEW

Everyone must have heard about the two parishes that will be closing in our area: St. Denis, which will be merging with St. Peter's, and Holy Trinity, which will be merging with St. John's. More parishes will still be affected and will be announced by Spring of next year; and the Cardinal indicated that assessment will be done more regularly in the future. Once again, St. Bart's is in good standing but we must grow from strength to strength.

CONNECTING IT ALL TO TODAY'S GOSPEL

In the gospel today, John tells us that Jesus' disciples remembered that it was written, "Zeal for your house will consume me'" (2:17). And Paul tells us in Romans to "never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord" (12:11). Like Jesus and the disciples, may we be zealous about our faith, our parish and the mission God has entrusted to us. Amen.

DEDICATION OF ST. JOHN LATERAN



Most Catholics think of St. Peter's as the pope's main church, but they are wrong. St. John Lateran is the pope's church, the cathedral of the diocese of Rome where the bishop of Rome presides.

The first basilica on the site was built in the fourth century when Constantine donated land he had received from the wealthy Lateran family.

That structure and its successors suffered fire, earthquake and the ravages of war, but the Lateran remained the church where popes were consecrated until Pope Gregory XI returned from Avignon in the fourteenth century to find the church and the adjoining papal palace in ruins.

Pope Innocent X commissioned the present structure in 1646. One of Rome's most imposing churches, the Lateran has a towering façade crowned with fifteen colossal statues of Christ, John the Baptist, John the Evangelist and twelve doctors of the Church. Beneath its high altar rests the remains of the small wooden table on which, according to tradition, Saint Peter celebrated Mass.

COMMENT: Unlike the commemorations of other Roman churches (St. Mary Major, August 5; Sts. Peter and Paul, November 18), this anniversary is a feast. The dedication of a church is a feast for all its parishioners. St. John Lateran is, in a sense, the parish church of all Catholics, for it is the pope's parish, the cathedral church of the bishop of Rome. This church is the spiritual home of the people who are the church.

QUOTE: "What was done here, as these walls were rising, is reproduced when we bring together those who believe in Christ. For, by believing they are hewn out, as it where, from mountains and forests, like stones and timber; but by catechizing, baptism and instruction they are, as it were, shaped, squared and planed by the hands of the workers and artisans. Nevertheless, they do not make a house for the Lord until they are fitted together through love" (Saint Augustine, Sermon 36).

STEWARDSHIP SUNDAY

The word "stewardship" is often invoked in religious circles to encourage members to be supportive of their $\frac{\text{stewardship}}{\text{SUNDAN}}$ congregation. That usually includes the contribution of financial support along with a commitment of time to assist in the work or ministry of the community. At its root, stewardship implies the responsible overseeing and protection of something worth caring for. In a congregation, true stewardship is a reciprocal relationship. It is very much like the covenantal relationship between God and His



people as described in the Bible. A faithful steward recognizes that what one has is not one's own possession. It is a gift, meant to be treasured, preserved, and used for the benefit of others. In turn, the community responds with care and support in time of need, because it too is a steward of the resources it has been given.
