NRA BASIC PISTOL CERTIFICATION TRAINING

Our training courses are conducted by: A Certified Chief Range Safety Officer, NRA Certified Pistol Instructors and Certified Range Safety Officers, and Firing Line Coaches.

THE BASICS

- Certification training is open to both men and women
- We teach the NRA Basic Pistol
 Phase II Certification Course (Note:
 Phase I must be taken online
 before you can advance to Phase
 II)
- You will earn a certification certificate upon completion of your training
- Cost: \$95
- Class Length: It is a one day course (Approximately 8 hours)

ABOUT THE COURSE

The NRA Basic Pistol Shooting Course teaches the basic knowledge, skills, and attitude for owning and operating a pistol safely. The course is at least 8-hours long and includes online classroom and range time learning to shoot revolvers and semi-automatic pistols. Students learn NRA's rules for safe gun handling; pistol parts and operation; ammunition; shooting fundamentals; range rules; shooting from the bench rest position, and two handed standing positions; cleaning the pistol; and continued opportunities for skill development.

WHERE IS THE CLASS HELD

REQUIREMENTS:

There are regulations regarding ammo and the indoor range at Castlewood Rod & Gun Club:

- If you shoot a .22, you can shoot indoors without any concern regarding type of ammo.
- If you shoot a caliber other than
 a .22, you must use Indoor Range
 Ammo. When you go to purchase
 your ammo, ask the salesperson
 for Indoor Range Ammo. If you are
 wondering the difference it is the
 copper plate on top of the bullet,
 Indoor Range Ammo only has 1/2
 of a copper plate on the bullet.
- If you do not have indoor range ammo, we have EXTREMELY LIMITED quantitles available for purchase. You will be limited to 25 rounds.
- This is a rule of Castlewood Rod & Gun Club, and it is essential that the rules are adhered to for safety

reasons.

• .40 or .45 caliber guns may NOT be fired on the indoor range.

SAFETY PRECAUTIONS

In an effort to make training safe for all students, instructors, range safety officers, etc ... the following rules and procedures have been implemented:

- 1. You must have your gun cased in either a rug, a holster, or a carrying case or you will not be permitted to shoot
- **2.** Your firearm MUST BE UNLOADED. Firearms will be checked by a Range Safety Officer.
- **3.** No Live ammunition in the classroom. Ammunition must be left in your vehicle

Note: Please understand that all rules, requirements, and regulations MUST be adhered to. They are in place for your safety and the safety of the Instructors and Range Safety Officers.
