

#### A Message from Your Treasurer:

Dear Aldersgate Family, I hope this message finds you well. As your treasurer, I wanted to share some important updates regarding our finances.



During the month of July, our donations exceeded expenses by \$2,855.33 - Thank you for your continuing support.

Our church has several upcoming HVAC expenses to include: replacement of two systems at a cost of \$9,800 each and one system with a compressor replacement at a cost of \$3,720. Additionally, there's a leak in the roof, and that will require \$2,940 to repair. The outside office brick steps still require attention but estimates for those repairs have not yet been pursued.

The Trustees, Finance Committee and Church Council met and authorized the HVAC replacement/repairs with the cost coming from the Memorial Fund. The roof repair will be accomplished at a later date as the HVAC repairs are priority.

As a result of these expenditures, the church will be launching a "Capital Campaign" to offset these costs and to restore those funds back into the Memorial Fund.

Your continued financial support is crucial. Please remain vigilant in your giving, and keep our church in your prayers. Together, we can ensure Aldersgate thrives.
