Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

1st Sunday Advent Year B

Are these the last days? The world surely is a mess! In Matthew 24:6, Jesus says, "You will hear of wars and rumors of wars; see that you are not alarmed, for these things must happen, but it will not yet be the end." We hear a lot of hysteria at times about certain hot spots around the globe, and unfortunately some preachers and politicians may capitalize on the world's misery to raise funds for their pet projects. Such doomsday phantasmagoria (scary show hype!) easily captures our imaginations to sell books and movies! But again, Jesus cautions us 'not to be alarmed'! Rather, Jesus says in today's gospel, 'Be watchful'! In fact, in the five verses of our short gospel reading, Jesus uses the word 'watch' four times! If we are vigilant and watchful, we remain responsible and ready to act instead of overreacting and worsening the situation. So, we are to keep faithfully at work, each person at their duty, and all of us should be found ready and waiting at the switch, when the Lord returns (the End comes)!

I know I tell the story a lot, but every time I hear gospel readings like today's about Jesus advising us to keep focused on our tasks at hand (to keep our 'noses to the grindstone'), I hear my mother saying the same thing when she would make a grocery run to the store. She would assign us a couple of household chores, and tell us that she was going to run to Charlie's IGA. We'd immediately ask, "What all are you going to buy?" with the purpose of figuring out HOW long she was going to be gone. Our intention was to see how many video game challenges we could get through before rushing through her job list quickly before she came back. Of course, she saw through our plan, and said, "Get to it – you better have them all done by the time I get back". In a similar way, Jesus anticipates our selfish preoccupations that keep us from being focused on following Him. If we think we have all year to work on bettering our discipleship with Him, then likely, we are going to come up short. So, Jesus says, 'Don't try to outguess God!" As disciples, we are to live as though each day is our last, and as if Jesus' return will be in the next second! Are we ready? There is never anything to panic about, if we have been diligent about keeping focused and faithfully accomplishing whatever Jesus has set before us as our 'Kingdom Work'. Get right to it!

We begin a new liturgical year with the Advent Season. We enter Year A, reading continuously through Mark's gospel each Sunday. I love how we have four gospel accounts of Jesus' teaching, His ministry and Life. I call it our view of Jesus from all four angles or seeing Him from all four directions! We can pick up unique details about Jesus from each of the four gospels. I always begin talking about Mark's gospel by saying that his gospel is the shortest! It is also the most 'action packed' and rushed, if we follow his hurried and 'so urgent' language. For example, Mark uses the word 'immediately' (Gk word euthys) forty-two times (compared to 6 times in Matthew, 3 times in Luke, & 3 times in John). Additionally, Mark uses the conjunction word 'and' (GK word 'Kai') to begin 410 of Mark's 678 verses in the original Greek (c. 60% of verses!). Mark is great about stringing together his dramatic action-filled story of Jesus' life and ministry! That use of conjunctions, plus his brevity, should keep us from falling asleep in the reading of his gospel!

AND (!), keep in mind that Mark has several unique literary devices he leans upon frequently, such as the repetition of phrases verbatim (like a 'eyewitness' account - 'just the facts, mam'), the use of 'triplets', and 'intercalation' which is also called 'sandwiching' a story within another story. Also, very unique to Mark's style of writing is what scholars call the 'Messianic Secret' or the frequent 'Silencing' that Jesus places upon miracle recipients, the demons and his own apostles regarding his true identity. Mark also portrays a 'crude realism' often about Jesus and events affecting Jesus. But we could engage in a whole class about the uniqueness of each gospel and the particular emphases that each gospel writer highlights in their work. More for another day! In the meantime, we hear Jesus tell us to keep focused and vigilant upon what we are called to do right now! Keep awake and Watch! Peace, Fr Brian
