Friday Millstream Brewing Co. will begin their weekend-long Wurst Festival celebration with a special limited release of the Wurst Beer Ever. Entertainment on Saturday and Sunday afternoon too.

The highly popular Dachshund Derby is 5 p.m. Saturday June 18 at the market barn. Sign up your dachshund by 4:30 p.m. the day of the race! On-site the registration will be held from 2:30 – 4:30 Saturday, June 18. The rules say, "if your dog is a dachshund or most likely a dachshund they are eligible." Height restrictions will be applied. Dogs must be fully vaccinated with proof vaccination either emailed or brought to the event. Registration is \$5. Dogs cannot be aggressive the race officials have the right to refuse any dog entry. Yes you may use treats and squeaky toys as "lures" in the race.

All day Saturday it's Weenies and Wine – a weenie=dipping sauce/ wine pairing event at Ackerman Winery especially planned for this event.

Iowa County Primary Election Results

Last Tuesday's primary election has resulted in a real contest for the Iowa County Board of Supervisors.

Though voter turnout in the State of Iowa was low with only 16% of all Iowa registered voters participating, in Iowa County it was slightly better with 18% of registered voters participating. In Iowa County 2,252 ballots were cast. There are 12,369 registered voters in Iowa County.

While the votes were not yet certified as of this writing, the big news in Iowa County results is that Supervisor incumbent John Gahring came in 4th in the Republican primary and lost his chance to be on the general election ballot next fall.

Republicans Jonathan Degen received 850 votes, Kevin Heitshusen got 713 votes and Chris Montross got 621. John Gahring received 604 votes. While Rick Rogers got 443 votes. Top Republican vote getter Degen did particularly well in the Lenox/ Iowa and Williamsburg precincts.

According to the Iowa County Auditors office, unofficially the ballot next fall will list Jonathan Degen, Kevin Keitshusen, Chris Montross and Kristie Wetjen. The top three vote getters next fall will earn one of three spots on the Iowa County Board of Supervisors as Vickie Pope resigned.

The top three Republican vote getters are placed on the general election ballot alongside the Democratic candidate Kristie Wetjen. Wetjen ran unopposed in the primary. Amana residents will recall that Wetjen was the executive director of the Amana Colonies Convention and Visitors Bureau in the 2000s and is currently the manager of the Outlet Mall of Williamsburg.

Surprisingly 409 Iowa County voters voted for Jim Carlin though that was not enough to defeat Chuck Grassley, longtime Republican incumbent in

If you cried she handed you a tissue, hugged you and listened. If you argued politics with her she would become fierce, but in the end never showed hatred.

Then there was the bridge games, or golf lessons and even swimming lessons. She didn't necessarily want to do them, but if asked she would try and master it no matter what. She just soldiered on!

There was a determination and fierceness that lay hidden in that little body of hers.

She was her mother's daughter - someone you could depend on, someone who was strong, someone who was loving and the best sister anyone could have and now I am left with the memory of that little shadow following me with her beautiful dark eyes.

In her quiet way you could always depend on her. We were like oil and water yet no one could come between us. We could argue, but always know that there was this invisible bond between us that would not, could not be broken.

So for awhile "good-bye, Kathy and go to Mommy and Daddy. Save a place for the rest of us please. We love you."

the United States Senate who garnered more than 1,200 Republican votes in Iowa County. Grassley handily won the state-wide contest to be placed on the general election ballot.

In Iowa County the Democratic results for U.S. Senator mirrored the statewide results with Michael Franken defeating Abby Finkenauer. Franken received 310 votes to Finkenauer's 253. Statewide Franken won by capturing 55% of the votes.

The election results in Iowa County will be canvassed and officially certified by June 14. After June 14 the results posted to the Iowa County.gov website will be official.


