Let it Snow! Winterization Tips

Winter is right around the corner and hopefully that means colder temps and SNOW! Home and cabin owners are encouraged to protect their property by winterizing and ensuring that they are ready for cold and freezing temps. The

three main causes of frozen pipes are: quick drops in temperature, poor insulation, and thermostats set too low. If pipes freeze and break, a 1/8-inch crack in a pipe can spew up to 250 gallons of water a day, causing a very high water bill, flooding, serious structural damage, and the immediate potential for mold. Prepare now by, insulating pipes in your home's crawl spaces, buildup, and attic. Seal leaks that allow cold air in near where pipes are located and use your shutoff/stop-and-waste valve to shut off and drain water from your pipes and outside faucets if leaving the home unattended. 



Fire Department Awarded Grant from Cal Fire
