Washington Institute 2019

NCJW Washington Institute April 7-9, 2019 Building a Movement, Not a Moment

About 30 NCJW members from throughout Florida joined hundreds of women from across the country at Washington Institute. From SE Atlantic Section, the following attended: Lois Seinfeld, Sue Gamer, Debbie Sachs, Lillian Kaminer, Phyllis Lyons and Dr. Steve Lyons, Janet Solitt and Barbara Spiller.

We heard many inspiring speakers, including students from MSD High School in Parkland, a group of grassroots feminist activists from Israel, and Senator Heidi Heitkamp, to name a few. Then, we went to Capitol Hill to meet with our Senators and Representatives to advocate in four key areas: better background checks to purchase guns; the Voting Rights Advancement Act; equal access to health care, including abortion; and a diverse, independent judiciary. The theme was "building a movement, not a moment." We were reminded often that advocacy is a marathon, not a sprint. The motto could have been: never give up. Below are remarks from some others who attended. — *Lillian Kaminer*

Sue Gamer: I found that the plenary on gender inequality in Israel was the most interesting. You often hear about conditions for women in other countries but sometimes it is hard to believe. I think the courage that was demonstrated by the women from Israel was amazing. Their work is truly an inspiration.

Debbie Sachs: What we heard over and over was that our advocacy work matters, and that we have to work even harder. Also, it was stressed that getting the vote out is vital.

Lois Seinfeld: It was awesome. The conference was well planned and the speakers were great. I really enjoyed meeting Rep. Lois Frankel. She is definitely a fan of NCJW. Also, she said it was important to keep speaking up for what we believe.
